Prelims

Prelims are mock exams designed to prepare students for their final exams. Prelims help students to gauge their understanding of the subject material, familiarise themselves with the exam format and identify areas that need improvement. They also give the teachers an idea of progress and readiness for the final exam.

- \succ They identify strengths and areas for development.
- Offer valuable feedback from the teachers once the paper has been assessed.
- If students are not coping with current level, prelims may identify if it would be more beneficial to move to a level where confidence can be built, and success can be achieved.





Supported Study

Lunch time and after school supported study is an additional learning opportunity offered to students outside of regular school hours. It provides extra help with coursework, exam preparation, or on specific subject areas that may need further support. The staff at Cumbernauld Academy give their time freely to reinforce learning, address challenges and build confidence in a more supportive environment.

- ➤ Many faculties in the school offer additional supported study sessions.
- ➤ Teachers will let students know when they are available, and the official timetable is also available on the school website.
- Department sessions won't necessarily be with your child's class teacher, but we encourage all young people to attend.




E-sgoil is online supported study available to everyone.


Attendance

Cumbernauld Academy UCAS Deadlines

By Friday 13th September	All pupils must register with UCAS and have completed their personal details.
Friday 20 th September	Pupils applying to Uni must be in the UCAS class during skills for lifetime where staff can work with each pupil. Pupils with an early deadline for application will be supported first. Support will be given on applications.
Friday 4 th October	Pupils should have discussed and shown their UCAS class teacher (Mr Sheridan and Mrs Milliken) what they wish to include in their personal statement.
Friday 11 th October	First draft of personal statement to be submitted to Mr O'Neill. Feedback will be provided ASAP.
Friday 1 st November	All personal statements completed and uploaded to UCAS.
Friday 15 th November	All applications will be checked by Mr O'Neill and other staff. A reference will be written and uploaded to UCAS.
Friday 29 th November	All applications checked by Mr O'Neill and Mrs McGuigan and sent to UCAS.
