Pupil Council: Five of our pupil council were our voices today at a Young Scot "Creating a Healthier Scotland" event.


Political Literacy: Well done to Louisa McCearney who successfully campaigned to become the MSYP for Bellshill.

Mrs Murray faculty head said 'I am delighted for the girls, this is a superb opportunity and I know that they will make the most of it'.






Interesting Activities

Myanmar/Burma has faced enormous difficulties since it fell under the rule of a military junta between 1962 and 2011. The country has experienced decades of war and poverty, but is entering a new era and held its first general election in twenty years in 2010.

It was a unique and worthwhile opportunity for pupils to hear Cardinal Bo's story and to participate in workshops, interactive activities and music raising awareness for our young people and how they, as global Christian citizens, can help change the world.

Mercy and compassion were highlighted as an important part of the healing process that Myanmar has to undergo, especially highlighted during this year of mercy.



fun filled games reflecting on the corporate acts of Mercy and how these are lived by St Vincent de Paul parish groups


and school groups across the country.
