
# Primary 4a Newsletter

#### **Our Learning Achievements**

Literacy & Language

Our class are enjoying working with partners to explore our novels and develop our reading strategies. We have also been working on note taking, good listening and talking skills. Our class enjoyed giving prepared talks on our fabulous models of Victorian homes and inventions. We have also been developing our spelling strategies and writing genres. In particular, reports, poetry and narrative writing through our IDL topics.





Working with partners, we learnt different ways of remembering how many days in each month and have been developing mathematical language to talk about the properties of 2D and 3D shapes. In groups we created bar graphs independently using the theme of Halloween. We have also been learning about place value up to tens of thousands, addition and multiplication with carrying and subtraction with exchange building up to thousands in formal calculations. Our class have had great fun creating word problems for division, discussing and solving them with our partners. We even put the problems in different genres; humor and horror...



In P.E. we had great fun working on controlling our ball skills and have recently been creating sequences of balances and rolls in gymnastics. Our class have also been participating in the Run to Rio challenge which has helped build our fitness. We have explored feelings and have shared some great ideas for coping with them. This term, as part of our new IDL P4a are looking at the UN Rights of The Child. We have linked this to our prior knowledge of how Victorian children lived and thought about what this means for us today as Global citizens and the rights of children around the world.



We have just started learning our ceilidh dances for our Christmas party. In art we learnt about proportion of the face and made super houses and poppy pictures. We love learning our new songs for our class assembly and our music assemblies with Mrs. McMillan!



In RME we have been learning about Christian values through stories about Jesus. Our new mini IDL theme this term is Christmas Around The World looking at how different countries celebrate the Christian celebration of Christmas.

Social Studies & Science Recently we explored the Gun Powder Plot and also what Remembrance day means to us and our families through reading a beautiful poem, "Where the Poppies Grow'. In science we explored how water can change forms with Mrs. Richmond.

We enjoyed our ICT lessons with Mrs. Richmond and have made power points. We have also used the computers to research topics and play games to help with number work and have begun blogging about our learning this year.
