Achievements 2015-16

- An increasing number of after school activities continue to be offered throughout the session from Primary 1 to Primary 7, this has included football, tennis, dance, badminton, art, cookery, gardening.
- The Rights Respecting Schools committee have also achieved *Recognition of Commitment* for Rights Respecting Schools status and continue on our journey towards achieving Level 1 in the next session.
- This session the school was awarded Social Enterprise Status and received their award from John Swinney, Depute First Minister at an awards ceremony in Edinburgh and continue towards achieving Fairtrade Status.
- The Eco Committee worked very hard and were successful in achieving an ECO Flag for our school. They have also secured a £12,000 Grant to modify the playground and create an outdoor classroom from the "Bags of Hope" charity in Tesco.
- Our School Dance Team featuring both boys and girls known as "The Eastfield All Stars" entered the NLC "Dance Mania" for the first time and received excellent feedback.
- Children in the nursery and school also participated in a number of competitions in sports, art, poetry, Euro Quiz and Library Quiz. The Primary Seven children were successful in achieving first place in the "Maths Challenge" and second and third place at the "Science Fair" at Greenfaulds High School.
