Playground and Dogs

The school office have received several concerns from parents outlining safety risks regarding parents/carers and dogs within the school playground. As advised we have a system in place to support supervision within the playground from 8.45am. To help us support the health, wellbeing and safety of all children, all adults should remain **outwith the school gates** and I would respectfully ask adults not to congregate in groups at or near to the school gates or playground as this slows down access to the designated areas and causes delays for other parents/carers/adults collecting their child(ren).

Please drop your children off and pick them up from the designated points, continuing to follow the one-way system in operation around the school. **No dogs** are allowed within school grounds at any time.

New latecoming arrangements and Car Parking

As part of our commitment to supporting attendance and reducing latecoming the following new arrangements will be put in place from our return to school on 8th January 2024. All children arriving after 9am (until 9.15am) should enter via the P1 entrance gate and door and not via the main entrance. The school car park will also be monitored by staff at this time.

Please note that the school car park is for staff and visiting specialists at all times during the day, before and after school (including Breakfast Club).

Parents/carers without Eastfield Primary School child parking permits are not authorised to use the car park. Should you feel your child requires a parking permit please contact the school who will be happy to discuss this with you. I politely request that parents/carers do not enter the car park or use the car park as a drop off or turning point as this is not safe and unauthorised use can negatively impact the safety of children using the school bus or our nursery garden (8am to 6pm). I appreciate that the vast majority of parents are making alternative arrangements and I would like to thank you for your support in keeping all of our children safe.

Should you find parking challenging please note, car parking is available across the road at "The Smiddy" and a crossing patrol is there to ensure that children (and adults) can cross the road safely.

Furthermore, please be mindful of parking in the street behind the school, especially across residents' driveways. We have received a large number of complaints from local residents who have been blocked in and Police Scotland are now monitoring this situation.

As always, the Breakfast Club is available from 8.15am to support families with drop off arrangements and childcare.

Pantomime

We welcomed Theatre Online Ltd on Friday 22nd December to present their live theatre production of **Beauty and the Beast**. All children had the opportunity to take part in the audience at no cost. The cost has been joint funded by ticket sales from our Christmas Show and also supported by the Parent Council. I hope they enjoyed the performance.

I am delighted to announce that our school choir performed incredibly well in our local Tesco (Craigmarloch) on Wednesday 20th December. A huge thank you to Mrs Mills for leading the choir and organising the performances.
