# Playground and Car Park

The school have received several concerns from parents and members of the community outlining safety risks associated with children leaving the playground on their own.

As advised we have a system in place to support supervision within the playground and safe entry and exit points which is monitored by our staff.

Despite our previous communication requesting that parents/carers do not enter the playground, many are still choosing to do so. The large number of adults in the playground is making it increasingly difficult for class teachers to supervise their class on exit and keep all of our children safe.

We politely ask that all members of the school community support us and remain outwith the playground, following the one-way system which ensures safe and timely departure from the school grounds.

Information regarding entry and exit points for all children for Session 2024/2025 will be issued today. P1 to P3 children will use the green gate next to the Nursery (Red Zone) and P4 to P7 children will use the green gate next to the Senior Playground (Blue and Green Zones). P4 and P5 children will no longer enter or exit via the gate next to the Car Park.

The school leadership team will be supervising the playground to ensure that safety measures are in place; therefore, please do not be offended if you are asked to leave the playground. We would also ask that you inform family members and friends who may be collecting your child(ren) to avoid any uncertainty or embarrassment.

Please note, the school playground has an adult presence from 8.45am in line with NLC guidance and children should not be within the grounds prior to this time. Should your child(ren) require additional support to enter or leave the school building, please do not hesitate to contact the school where additional measures can be put in place.

Furthermore, please be mindful of parking in the street behind the school, especially across residents' driveways. We have received a large number of complaints from local residents who have been blocked in.

As always, the Breakfast Club is available from 8.15am to support families with drop off arrangements and childcare.
