- ★ Comment on the differing opinions of Brabantio and Othello of Desdemona in this scene (24). Knowing that this is a *tragedy*, what do you think is the significance of this exchange. Quote and explain.

Iago's Soliloquy – 1.3

A **soliloquy** is often amongst the most significant speeches in a Shakespearian play. Iago's soliloquy at the end of Act 1 in "Othello" reveals key information about Iago's plot and motives.

Explain (quoting if necessary) how the following is revealed on page 27/8...

- ★ lago's attitude towards and opinion of Roderigo...
- ★ lago's opinion of Othello and a reason for it...
- ★ Why lago is confident he will be able to exact revenge on Othello...
- ★ Another reason why lago is plotting and how he intends his plan to succeed...
- ★ (QUOTE) lago's characterisation of Othello and how he thinks this could work to his advantage...
- ★ lago's (inadvertent) characterisation of himself...
