Personal Belongings/ Toys and Games

All our children are benefiting from the new playground toys, we have a selection of games, balls, hoops and skipping ropes to name but a few. Due to the purchasing of these items, we are discouraging children from bringing their own footballs and playground toys to school. We can provide what the children need at school. If children bring these items to school, they will remain in the classroom until home time.

We will also discourage children from bringing toys and trading cards to school. We understand that these items can be a comfort or are precious to your child/children and therefore we would not like to see personal belongs damaged or broken. Accidents happen and we have had occasions where children's own toys have been dropped in puddles, broken, or lost. Children can become distressed at this, therefore, to support all pupils we will offer our own playground toys only.

Finally, trading cards. These cards again mean a great deal to their owners. Children enjoy trading their cards but they sometimes request the cards back. Younger children can find it difficult to understand trading and they can become upset. Teaching staff and support staff

are regularly spending time trying to resolve these issues. This takes away from valuable learning and teaching time. Trading cards should not be brought to school.

The only exception to all the above is during in class Fun 31 on a Friday afternoon. Class Teachers may invite your child to bring in a toy or activity to play with during this time.
