

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Phonics

- Please practice the Phoneme words and common words on back sheet
 - Matching words, Snap, Make a Word Search, Writing Sentences
 - Writing words out Rainbow Spelling, Dotty spelling, Best Handwriting




Handwriting



- Write each word from the common words 4 times using the correct formation, letter position and letter joining
- Think of a sentence for each word and in your best handwriting write it out twice. Remember to check you punctuation.
- Please write out the handwriting exercises at the back of booklet paying close attention to letter position and letter join
- Copy sentences from a book or magazine in your best handwriting remembering letter size and positions.

Writing



Remember to check punctuation!

- Write sentences using words from the book.
- Draw a picture and write a detailed paragraph about your daily news
- Draw a picture and write a descriptive paragraph about the character from the book
- Write a book review for each novel sharing your views
- Write your full name, address and family members names
- Write sentences using the words from back sheet.
- Draw a picture and write a paragraph about your hobbies
- Make a list of wow words to describe different emotions

Talking and Listening



Talk to your family about: -

- The books you have read sharing e.g. Main Point, Setting, Main Characters. Discuss what you liked and didn't like.
- Play games and draw pictures with your family
- Discuss what you see and can hear when you look out your window
- Discuss with your family what you could do to help in the house
- Discuss with your family what you are going to have for breakfast, lunch and dinner.

Remember it is good to talk and listen to each other.


