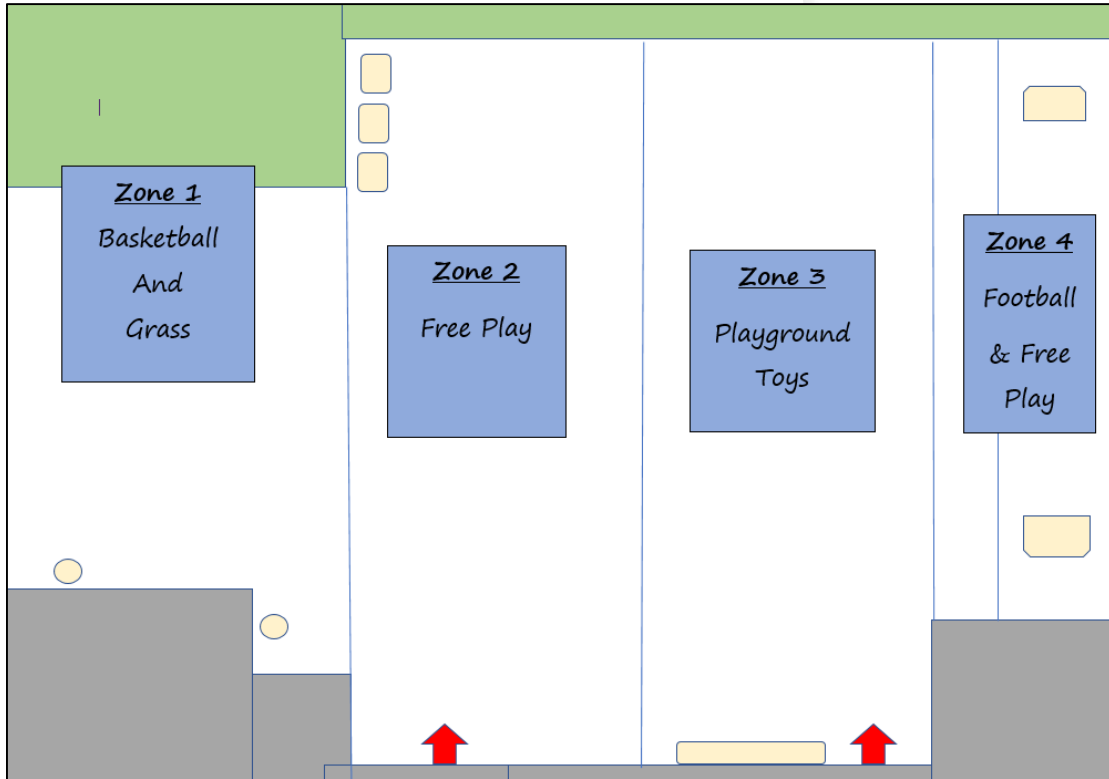

Orbiston Community Hub Update

Exciting plans to create a new community hub in Orbiston have taken a major step forward after planning permission was granted for the new facility.

Councillor Angela Campbell, Convener of Education, Children and Families, said: “This is such good news and will be welcomed by so many people in the community including the 500 children who will attend each day.

“It is an ambitious project, which will provide pupils and teachers with a wonderful learning environment and also provide the local community with a range of high-quality outdoor spaces and indoor facilities.”

The key features of the new Orbiston Community Hub include:

- The existing Lawmuir and Scared Heart Primary Schools will be replaced with modern, purpose-built facilities within the community hub.
- A nursery facility will cater to the early learning needs of the community.
- A dedicated community hall and learning spaces, providing opportunities for a wide range of activities and gatherings.



- The project encompasses both free play areas and equipped play areas, including a school garden, to promote outdoor play.
- A multi-use games area (MUGA) and a seven-a-side all-weather pitch.
- Staff and visitor car parking facilities.

Bring a Jacket to School

We always advise that pupils bring a filled water bottle to school. **We ask that pupils bring water bottles that are plastic only. No Glass.** We have had a number of breakages which pose a danger in school. Thanks.

Science in R12

This week in Science R12 carried out an experiment with ice. The children predicted what materials would melt the ice the fastest without force. They then tried it out using the materials they asked for. Some children used salt, hot water, body heat and insulation to melt their ice cube. We recorded our predictions then noted the actual time taken.
