Environmental Review Checklist

The aim of the Environmental Review is to help the Eco Committee get a clear view of the current environmental "picture" of the whole school and it must be completed by the Eco Committee with the help of other members of the school community. It will help to identify where improvements can be made and should be used to help the Eco Committee decide which topics should be part of the school's Action Plan.

The checklist is divided into sections mirroring the ten Eco-Schools Scotland's environmental topics, currently: Litter, Waste Minimisation, Energy, Water, Transport, Health &Well-being, School Grounds, Sustaining our World, Biodiversity and Food and the Environment.

One way to use the checklist is to divide each section between groups of Eco Committee members and other pupils so that different groups concentrate on different areas. Let each group work through their allocated area and then ask them to come together and discuss their findings. You should produce a summary of your findings and display it in a way that the rest of the school can easily understand.

You MUST carry out the whole Environmental Review annually, looking at all ten of the Topics. This is an essential requirement for Green Flag Award status, and we'll ask you to sign a declaration that you've completed your Review and shared its results as part of your Green Flag Award application.
