Health Matters

As you are aware, our children's health is very important. Mrs Lilly and Mrs Govan have organised a range of activities are planned for our DAY of ACTION. This is planned for Friday 22nd March. Scot Roger from Spotty Dog Adventures will be working with us too! We are encouraging our children to wear blue and donate £1 to water aid.

Weather: Due to the condition of our playgrounds during periods of snow and ice we will often need to keep the pupils indoors during intervals. While this is not an ideal situation for pupils or staff, I am sure that you can understand that the pupils' safety is our key priority. P.E Kit: We deliver two hours of Physical Education in school each week. This is an important part of your child's education. All children are encouraged to bring their full gym kit for P.E, but the minimum requirement is a pair of gym shoes. All children should have a change of footwear for P.E lessons as outdoor shoes can mark and damage our gym flooring. We would ask you to ensure that your child has their P.E kit with them

on the appropriate days. Pupils may only be withdrawn from P.E if they bring a letter to school, signed by you, explaining why they should be withdrawn. Thank you in advance for your full support.

Head lice: Please remember to check your child's head on a regular basis for any signs of infection. It is no longer the role of the school nurse to do this and responsibility falls to the parent. The school can no longer inform parents of any outbreaks of head lice. Advice given by the school nurse is that checks should be made on a weekly/fortnightly basis. If a child has head lice, they should be treated before returning to school. Please seek advice from your local Pharmacist or G.P about which treatments are most effective.
