Dear Parents /Carers and friends,

Staff and pupils were delighted to return back to school and their nursery in August. We were particularly pleased at the positive cooperation shown from all parents and carers in keeping everyone safe with the COVID 19 restrictions and regulations currently in place;

- Parents and carers are 'dropping off' and 'picking up' their children beyond the perimeter fence
- Parents and Carers are encouraged to social distance 2m apart at one of our three gates
- Parents are asked NOT to visit the school unless they are invited in for an appointment by the HT / DHT or to collect a sick child
- <u>ALL authorised visitors to wear a mask in the establishment, sanitise, sign the appropriate PROTECT and TRACE</u> paperwork and follow the guidance from staff
- Pupils are accessing their Zones via any of the three gates;
 - Early Years / Nurseries RED ZONE

P1-4

- P5 7 **GREEN ZONE**
- Pupils arriving in their zones as near to the 9am start BELL as possible

YELLOW ZONE

- Pupils are supervised in all playgrounds by staff and SMT from 8.50am
- Breakfast Club children walk to the main entrance door of the school for 8.20am on their own where Breakfast Club staff are waiting.

Our Establishments continue to reflect the current concerns within the Covid—19. Internally classes have essential furniture and receive regular cleaning visits throughout the day. Each class has sanitisation stations, cleaning cloths and sprays suitable for a school environment and anti bacterial wipes. Pupils are assigned a Zone for playtime and lunchtime play. Support staff and SLT are shared amongst the two playground Zones for supervision. Staff socially distance to 2m apart. Signage shows staff and pupils the direction of flow up and down the corridors and up and down stairwells ie 'Keep to the Left'. Signage also reminds us to wash our hands regularly, wipe down common touch point areas after use and sanitise at the many sanitisation stations. PPE is available for every room. Windows are open for good ventilation and doors are ajar for more free-flow and reduction in touch points. Outdoor activities are encouraged for Health and fitness and to allow time out of the classroom for study. Classrooms can visit the hall for activity too. We encourage pupils not to bring in toys from home to school, but keep belongings to a minimum.


WE ARE A DIGITAL SCHOOL an Nursery

In Term 1 we are on a RECOVERY phase, revisiting and consolidating phonemes, common

HEALTH PROMOTING ESTABLISHMENTS and AUTHORITY



We are a NUT FREE school and Nursery. We have staff and pupils who need your urgent care in keeping everyone safe. Please read the ingredients on snacks, chocolate spreads ie Nutella and biscuits. They should NOT be in our establishments. Our staff will continue to monitor pack lunches to ensure we remain a NUT FREE ZONE!

ALL pupils in the school will receive a new water bottle. We promote that everyone drinks lots of water during the day to keep pupils and staff refreshed and hydrated. We have several drinking wells in the school and nursery to encourage this. Please do NOT provide juices or fizzy drinks and cans. They are not promoted in any of our establishments.

Our Nursery children also have access to fresh water and milk.

If you are providing a healthy PACKED LUNCH, please ensure that your child has a limited amount of sweets. Again by reducing the sugar intake each day, helps to grow healthy bodies and healthy and teeth.



GLOW – A Guide for Parents

Glow - What is it?

Glow is the world's first national safe and secure online community for pupils, parents and teachers. Glow gives access to information and activities including interactive educational games, revision papers, links to other sites and news features. These resources support pupils to learn in innovative and exciting ways. Glow has a number of key features and access to, or restrictions to, these features is dependent on the permissions set by the local authority. Not all features are relevant to all users.

How does it work?

Each child or teacher is given unique logins to access this trusted, safe environment where they can create personalised programmes of work, share resources or help parents understand and become more involved in their children's learning by keeping up to date with their progress and achievements.

How does it assist my child's learning?

For children, Glow is:



- A tool to access the benefits of the internet and a range of online learning resources
- A space for collaborating with other learners
- A facility to connect with teachers about learning
- A space to create and innovate as you learn

Why use it?

The constantly evolving digital world has transformed the way in which our children communicate, network, seek help and access information to learn. Glow provides tailored resources, appropriate to the children in a safe, secure and engaging way. It is particularly useful in exceptional times of school closures, extreme weather etc.

What are the benefits?

Glow is a secure and safe setting. It will facilitate continuity of learning

during school closures.

How does my child get access?

Your child will be given access by the school via a secure username and password. This gives your child access to information and resources suitable to them.

A pupil's access to, and view of, Glow will be different from a teacher's view.

Can my child access Glow anywhere?

As it is web-based, Glow can be used wherever an internet connection is available, such as on a desktop, laptop, tablet or mobile device.

All your child needs is their unique username and password.

How can I, as a parent, use Glow?

You will be able to view and access the same information as your child.

Through your child's password, you have access to all the national material. Parents cannot be given separate user names and passwords for Glow.

Wider digital access

Your child will also have been given usernames and passwords for other online learning platforms that the school has deemed appropriate; these could include Sumdog, Active Learn etc. These are unique to your child and teachers will continue to monitor these during school closures.

PARENTS' PORTAL Please read this information carefully and act upon it!

In support of North Lanarkshire Council's ambition to continue improvement in parental communications and its broader Digital NL plans we have been working with national organisations to develop a "Parents Portal".

The portal has been and will continue to be developed to provide parents with a clear insight to their child's education and to support transactional communications between parents and the school, this includes attendance, reports and school information.

The development was piloted last session in a small number of schools, when it was within its first phase. Since then more features have been added and North Lanarkshire has moved forward its own digital communication

This first phase will introduce basic information about the school and include services such as

- online school payments,
- attendance,
- placing request forms,
- the annual data check
- general school information

As the development of the Portal continues, it is hoped to add features such as reporting absences and permission slips for excursions, etc.
