

Infant Adverse Weather Activities

In the event that the school is closed due to adverse weather you may wish to do some of these activities with your child.



How many points can you collect?

<p>2 points</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">• Count from 0-20 and 20-0• Count objects e.g. snowballs, footprints in the snow• Play I Spy• Sing Nursery Rhymes - find the rhyming words, play spot the mistake by singing it wrong• Write down or draw a picture of the weather for the day• Go on a sound/number hunt - in the house, outside, on the TV, in the newspaper or even when eating alphabet spaghetti• Watch the weather forecast to see what the weather will be like the next day.	<p>5 points</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">• Practise numbers, sounds and phonemes - in the snow, in the bath, with paper and pencil, on each other's backs, wherever you like!• Read your reading book and any other books in the house (10 minutes)• Join sounds and phonemes together to make words e.g. c a t, sh o p• Make flashcards of the alphabet and put them in alphabetical order. Can you find an object to match each letter?• Go on a shape hunt and draw the shapes you find• Create a winter picture
<p>8 points</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">• Practise writing common words - speed writing, rainbow writing, make flashcards, with paint• Read your reading book and retell the story in your own words• Make a snowman and measure it with your hands/feet/ruler/measuring tape• Compare the size of your snowman with someone else's snowman.• Make up some adding and takeaway sums (if you have done this before in class)	<p>10 points</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">• See how fast you can sledge down a hill, record your times and see if you can beat your previous time• Make a 3D snow sculpture• Make a diary of what you did throughout the day• Make up your own weather forecast• Find out something new that you didn't know before and get ready to share it with the class• Make up a winter poem or song
