Features of Instructions

Instructions usually contain:

- A title
- A list of things resources that you will need.
- Numbered steps (each step set out on a new line).
- A sequence of steps set out in the right order.
- Verbs at the start of each sentence (put, get, sprinkle, cut, spread etc).

Try to imagine you are writing a set of instructions for a friendly alien! The instructions will have to include all the steps for our alien because he won't have done it before.

Here he is, our friendly alien called Aaron!
