

Double Exposure

This week you are going to start a new book called Double Exposure. You can search for this on Oxford Owl. This week, you should read chapters 1, 2 and 3 and complete the tasks below.

Task 1

Metalinguistics

Read chapter 1 and then complete the task below. There are lots of new words in this chapter and we will have a look at them. You should find each word in the book and read the sentence it is in. Then you should read back and read forward to try and work out what it means. You could also try replacing it with a different word to see if it makes sense. Once you think you know what it means, write this word in the middle column, and then check all words in a dictionary at the end.

Task 2

After reading chapter 2, write a summary about what has happened so far in chapters 1 and 2. We have found out about the competition and who Martin has partnered up with but is he happy about it? Look back at these chapters and find the main points of the story so far. Remember to write your summary in your own words and imagine you are retelling the story to someone to tell them about what has happened.

Task 3

After reading chapter 3, you will have found out about Martin and Sophia's argument. They have been partnered up together but do not want to be. In some ways these characters are very similar but, in some ways, they are also very different. For this task, you should create a visualiser for each character, using the information that you have found out so far. Remember to draw a picture of the character with their name above and then write the words and sentences to describe them around the picture. In your visualisers, you should look out for any similarities or differences amongst the characters. You should underline any similarities and circle the differences as you compare the two characters.
