

Stranded in School

This week you are going to write a narrative story using your imagination. I would like you to imagine that you have somehow been stranded in school and you need to spend the night in school. You might be left all alone in the school or you might have a friend with you. Try to think about what could have happened to make this happen. Were you in the toilet when the janitor locked the door? Were you hiding somewhere to stay in the school? Try to come up with an idea of how you could be left in school alone or with a friend. You will have to describe how you were feeling and what you did. We know that when we go back to school, things might be different, and classes might look different, but I want you to think about the school as it was before. Try to use your imagination about what you might do in the school with no one else there. Do you go into other classes? Do you play with the different resources? Do you eat food from the dinner hall kitchen? Where do you sleep? What do you do? Try to use lots of adjectives to describe what you did and how you felt during this. And finish your story with how you finally get out of school and how this felt. Make sure you have a good ending to complete your story. Remember to write your story using paragraphs and take a new paragraph for a new idea or new part of the story.
