



In the event that the school is closed due to adverse weather, here are some activities that you can complete. How many points can you score?

<p><b>2 points</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• How many hibernating animals can you name?</li> <li>• Name 3 evergreen trees.</li> <li>• Create a winter scene using materials of your choice.</li> <li>• Measure and record the depth of snow on 3 separate occasions.</li> <li>• Make a snowflake.</li> <li>• Write a times table in the snow.</li> </ul>	<p><b>5 points</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Create a WINTER acrostic poem.</li> <li>• Make a snowman and measure it with a measuring tape.</li> <li>• Keep a snow diary – what have you done each day?</li> <li>• Fill a small container with snow and measure how long it takes to melt. Then measure how much liquid the snow produced.</li> <li>• Create a word search using winter words.</li> </ul>
<p><b>8 points</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Create a winter workout – how can you keep fit in the snow?</li> <li>• Create a persuasive poster advertising your winter workout.</li> <li>• Research a healthy, warming winter recipe. Ask an adult to help you make it.</li> <li>• Write a set of clear instructions for your winter recipe.</li> <li>• Write a winter story.</li> <li>• How fast can you sledge down a hill? Record your time and see if you can beat it.</li> </ul>	<p><b>10 points</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Create a winter scrapbook, tracking the changes in weather. Illustrate through diagrams, newspaper cut outs, weather reports from TV or radio.</li> <li>• Design a winter themed game. You can choose to base it on number or spelling.</li> <li>• Be a winter worker – how many chores can you help with in the house/garden.? E.g. clear a path, wash the dishes, make your bed</li> </ul>
