Transport Costs

Throughout the year we have a variety of events and activities taking place just like the Cross Country or Theatre in Scotland events.

Some events are free, but a significant number have an attached cost. With all events comes subsequent transport costs also.

Combined, an average trip to one of these events can cost around £12 per child. We use our school funds to subsidise these trips and where events are not optional, we try to cover the cost completely like transition events at CNHS.

To help with ongoing transport costs I will begin to ask for a contribution towards the overall cost and where an event is selected by the teacher as an educational trip, I will ask for a transport + event contribution.

Where possible we will always try to subsidise from the school fund for all our children to minimise the cost for all our families.

Toys in School

Children like to bring toys, cards, footballs and other items from home. While, in a perfect world this would be lovely, it leads to problems for our teachers and playground staff.

"It's my ball, you're not playing", "She took my dolly!", "He took my cards", "I've lost my....." etc.
