Attendance and timekeeping

As you will be aware attendance at school is a major area of concern across the country and indeed across the UK. At St. Gerard's we have maintained 91% for the last 2 years but we need to move towards 95% attendance which reflects a normal amount of school sickness within a given academic year. So far, our average attendance is displayed below. Many thanks for all your efforts.

Lateness and Timekeeping

Children who are late for school can experience anxiety and get a bit nervous on entering their classroom. While their teacher will welcome them accordingly, it is in their best interests that they are on time.

Our school day

- **Prayer which settles and helps us begin our day as a class**

(Late arrivals miss out of this important part of the day and disrupt the prayerful harmony of the moment).

- **Register for attendance is taken and children have a little news check in with their teacher.**

(Late arrivals have to report to office to be registered which adds to disruption).

- **Register for school lunches which is online and helps catering staff get organised for lunch.**

(Late arrivals must report to catering staff or the office to have their lunch request recorded which again adds to the morning routine being disrupted).

- **Children set to task**

(Late arrivals necessitate the teachers need to repeat learning and again disrupt the class routine).

End of day attendance

We have also noticed an increase in children being collected early from class in the afternoon. Again, while this may be occasionally required for family or health reasons, it disrupts the learning of the child, and they can miss out in news for the following day. They also miss out in the routine of final prayer that closes the circle of the day.

These daily transitions are well planned and organized by staff and help your child to belong and settle into the rhythm of school life. While we understand that emergencies and events occur it would be great if, when we do not have emergencies, we could support our children to be present in line at the beginning and end of the day. Your help with all of the above is genuinely appreciated and where we know of particular issues with children and families, we ask that you do not allow the above information to add further stress or anxiety.
