



## What Are We Learning About

As the children learn the Makaton symbol for 'listen', they will also be learning poems, rhymes and songs and will be learning to recite these. Whilst learning about Scotland and China, the children have shown a great interest in exploring different countries, cultures, and customs. We look forward to exploring this further with the children through a multi-cultural context for learning. Children will have the opportunity to create and describe patterns whilst exploring flags from a variety of countries. They will be given the opportunity to explore and search for information about different countries and their traditions using technology. Children will be then be developing their awareness of how to value others and appreciate their special qualities.

# Personal Belongings

As we promote independence we would ask where possible that your child comes to nursery wearing clothing and shoes that they can easily remove and put on e.g., Velcro/slip on shoes. Please ensure that all items of your child's clothing and footwear are clearly labelled with their name so that these items can be easily returned.

#### **Nappy Changing**

If your child is currently in nappies, they have their own personal box to store their nappies within our changing area. We would ask that you ensure that your child has an adequate supply of nappies within the nursery for staff to use to change your child. Staff will make you aware of when the supply is running low and requires to be replenished. These should not be stored within your child's bag within the cloakroom area.

#### **Clothing Donations**

We are running low on spare clothing within our nursery and would ask that if you have any spare clothes at home that no longer fit your child and are still in good condition could you please donate these to our nursery. In particular we are running low on trousers so any donations would be appreciated. Please give any donations to your child's key worker.
