
What Is New Year?

What would you say to somebody who is celebrating New Year's Day?




How is New Year celebrated in the United Kingdom?



In Scotland:

- The cannons fire at the stroke of midnight at Edinburgh Castle.
- New Year's Eve is called 'Hogmanay' and people celebrate with gifts.



In England:

- Thousands of people watch fireworks in London and Big Ben strikes at midnight to welcome the new year.
- On 1st January, there is a parade in London which has happened every year since 1987.



In Ireland:

- Many people enjoy big firework displays and events in large cities, including Belfast and Dublin.
- Lots of people enjoy small parties in their homes.



In Wales:

- New Year is called 'Calennig'. This means 'first day of the month'.
- In the Welsh capital city of Cardiff, there are lots of celebrations including live music, fireworks, ice skating and fairground rides.
- Many people give bread and cheese as gifts.

What Is the New Year Song?




The traditional song many people sing on New Year's Eve is called 'Auld Lang Syne'. Sometimes, people shake hands while they sing it. Can you do this with your friends?
