Star Pupils are chosen fortnightly by their teachers and children are given this award for a variety of reasons, underpinned by our values. At Star Pupil assemblies, some children from the 'focus values class' will join the Head Teacher and share how the value of the month has impacted on their learning in school, at home and in the community.

All awards over the session contribute to the 'Citizen of the Year' award for infants, juniors and seniors.



Meaning

Character Education – School of Character

<u>Meaning:</u>

IN BALMALLOCH, our values curriculum involves teaching children through values across the year. Our values for APRIL are HUMILITY AND FORGIVENSS. Through learning experiences, children will truly understand 'HUMILITY' and what it means to be humble. Children will become more self-aware, realising 'it is far more impressive when others discover your good qualities without your help.'

We will encourage children to understand the importance of FORGIVENESS, saying sorry and meaning it if we have upset someone. Children will learn that although it is sometimes hard to ask for or give forgiveness we can work on it together. Through our restorative approaches, when children attend 'Reflection Room' they have the opportunity to reflect on their words and actions, taking steps to act in a more positive way. 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
