### Sexual Health Education - Questions and Concerns

#### RSHP.scot

"In the instance of a parent wishing to withdraw a school aged child from sexual health education lessons, schools must remind parents of the child's right to an education and to participate, bearing in mind their age and maturity. Where, after due consideration ... the parent or carer decides to withdraw a school aged child from sexual health education lessons, arrangements should be made for the child to have alternative positive educational provision, which meets the Health and Wellbeing outcomes."

"Aspects of RSHP education may be discussed in many areas of the curriculum and it would not be possible for a child or young person to be withdrawn from lessons across the curriculum as this would prevent the child or young person from receiving an adequate and holistic education."

It should be recognised that other children will participate in Relationships, Sexual Health and Parenthood education in Term 4 of the school year, with a focus on the content appropriate to their age and stage of development. It is important, therefore, that there is an understanding that children will talk to each other, which may include discussing what had been taught as part of the RSHP programme and it cannot be guaranteed that a child not taking part will not be involved in such conversations when socially engaging with their peers.

## Post COVID

- Any entrance can be used
- Drop-off and pick up only in the roundabout area of the school and nursery grounds
- Disabled badge holders only in the car park
- Tuck shop can be reintroduced in August important that children do not spend their
  money for lunch at the tuck shop as any outstanding amounts will need to be paid before
  any further items can be purchased. This will ensure the catering staff can place orders in
  the appropriate timeframe.
- It is essential that we continue to encourage pupils to wear full school uniform associated
  with Balmalloch Primary School and Nursery Class, being proud representatives of our
  school and nursery community. The P7 Pupil Representatives and the HT have discussed
  the issues of changing and have agreed that children can come to school with their PE
  uniform on their PE days but they must wear their school jumper or cardigan which should
  be red. Pupils are not permitted to wear 'hoodies or brands' to school apart from on 'dress
  down/fundraising' days.

School uniform consists of black/grey trousers, white shirt or polo shirt, tie, red jumper or cardigan.

PE uniform - Black/grey jogging trousers, white polo shirt. Red jumper or cardigan should be worn on PE days when participating in activities in other areas of the curriculum.
