Dear Parents/Guardians,

Welcome back! I hope you have all had a fabulous Christmas break. Term 3 is always a busy and hard working term, with lots to fit in. Our class assembly is also this term on Friday 10<sup>th</sup> February. We hope you will be able to join us for that.

### Homework

A list of suggested activities and websites will be handed out at the start of every term.

If your child wishes to complete any of these tasks that is great. Homework can be handed in whenever completed, however the main focus is very much on reading. Every child should be reading for at least 10 minutes a day. We encourage all children to do this and keep a note of it in their reading records. The homework grid can also be found on our class team.

### Literacy

We will continue to build confidence with our class reading strategies. We will continue to work on our fluency and inference skills. We will also be exploring the main ideas of the text. Please ask your child what book they are reading and let them tell you the story so far.

Our writing genres this term will be persuasive and information, these will both tie in with our topic.

As part of Talking and Listening we will be looking at Scots Language. This will include learning a Scots poem, creating a Scots dictionary and acting out some Scots drama activities.

### Maths

This term we will continue working on division and its link to multiplication. From here we will move onto fractions. Both these areas will help with our work on money and time.

### Interdisciplinary Learning

This term our topic is the Scottish Wars of Independence. This will allow the children to learn more about the history of Scotland and the impact this has had on our world today. This will also tie in with our Expressive arts programme as we will be looking at Scottish artists, learning Scottish songs and more Scottish dancing.

There is a change to our PE timetable. Our indoor gym days will be Thursday and Friday and outdoor gym on a Wednesday. Children should come to school dressed in their gym kit Wednesday, Thursday and Friday.

Mrs McDaid will take RME and PE with the children on a Thursday. This term we will be working on our gymnastic skills.
