The day before the swimming was due to start 8 parents/carers had not contacted the school to advise if their child was attending swimming. The clerical team had to contact parents/carers individually as arrangements had to be made for children to stay in school whilst their class was at the swimming pool. It is essential we have this information when the letters go out to families as we need to give the swimming pool notice if we are cancelling a session. This also impacts on the parent helpers who have offered to help but are no longer required for the morning session. It is also essential that we organise the classes children are going into if they are not taking part and this can have an impact on the children if they don't know in advance.

HEAD INJURY - REPORTING TO PARENTS/CARERS

HEAD INJURIES AND CONCUSSION

Background

A concussion is a type of brain injury that changes the way the brain normally works. A concussion is caused by a bump, blow, or jolt to the head. Concussions can also occur from a fall or blow to the body that causes the head and brain to move rapidly back and forth. Even what seems to be a mild bump to the head can be serious. All concussions are serious. Most concussions occur without loss of consciousness. Recognition and proper response to concussions when they first occur can help aid recovery and prevent further injury, or even death.

Children and adolescents are at greatest risk of concussions with the greatest risks occurring during activities where collisions may occur. This can happen in or outside of school. Concussions can have more serious effects on a young, developing brain and need to be addressed correctly to prevent further injury and help with recovery. It is important to note that subsequent concussions can be much more threatening than a single concussion.

Head Injuries at School

Head injuries may occur at school if a child's head comes into contact with a hard object such as a desk or the floor or during potential collisions in physical education classes, school based activities or recess times. These incidents are significant because students must be screened and stuff must understand that concussion symptoms can be delayed or progressive

Procedures for Head Injuries at School

- Parent/Carer will have written confirmation of the head injury that has occurred, with a copy being stored in school to ensure Health and Safety procedures are being followed.
- Parent/Carer is notified by telephone to ensure they check their child's bag for written confirmation.
- Emergency contact will be contacted if 3 attempts to contact the parent/carer have failed.
- Children should be monitored for 30 minutes after a forceful head injury. National advice highlights that anyone sustaining a forceful head injury should seek medical attention.
- Children who have no symptoms may return to class if parents/carers are in agreement but
 must be advised to return if symptoms develop as symptoms are not always present
 immediately. This is an important consideration 48 hours following a concussion.
- Children with underlying neurological conditions, should be dismissed to home if any forceful blow occurs. Children with cognitive impairments that are difficult to assess, or children that developmentally unable to articulate symptoms should be deferred to medical care rather than being observed at school. Children who have sustained a recent brain injury or are recovering from prior concussion should be dismissed home and must see a medical professional before returning to school and activities.

FAMILY ENGAGEMENT GROUP

- Parent Helpers To increase number of helpers by 60% on initial uptake. Parent/Carer
 helpers will contribute to and enhance the learning outcomes of children in the school. This
 can be linked to parent helpers required for swimming or on trips but also to support groups in
 school.
- Parent Council Membership Parent Council membership to increase by 60% to improve outcomes for learners through effective partnership working.
- Family Focus Group Create and implement a Family Focus Group of members across the school to provide and support family-centred approaches in learning in school and at home.

Unfortunately, at this time we have only had two parents putting themselves forward to join a Family Focus Group to support this priority. We need the support of our families to take this priority forward to improve outcomes for children, working with Mr Paterson - Acting Principal Teacher.

This is part of our 'Family Learning and Engagement' priority and journey as a Character School, promoting 'civic duty' and knowledge and understanding of our values in the community. As a school, we are supporting our children to develop their skills not only at school but as part of a wider community (e.g.) choir performing at the care home for residents, digital leaders supporting skills in the community, supporting younger pupils or taking care of our environment, for example, showing our values in all aspects of life.

Parents/carers/family member can participate in as many activities with their child as they want to. As a school, we want to recognise the contribution made by members of community. Over the years we have organised many activities and events, with these now planned across the school year. North Lanarkshire Council asked the Head Teacher to contribute to the 'Parental Engagement Strategy' refresh as a result of the steps we have taken to promote and encourage family engagement in learning. Our Flagship Family Award has been highlighted as good practice, with a copy being shared with other Parent Council Chairs and the strategy group.

We plan to have early lunch on the above dates to allow the doors to open at 1.15pm with the aim of the concert beginning at 1.30pm.

PEF FUND 2023/24

PEF ALLOCATION (PUPIL EQUITY FUND) - £66150.00

As a full-time member of staff has been redeployed following the completion of the 'actual' staffing exercise in September, our PEF plan had to be reviewed. Initially, two PEF teachers were being funded by Balmalloch Primary PEF allocation and match funded by North Lanarkshire Council. After the redeployment of Miss Steel, Primary 3b did not have a class teacher so Mrs Patrick, previously Nurture Teacher, took over the role after the October holidays. As a result, this impacted on the nurture provision that could be provided.

It is essential to ensure all classes have a teacher before any interventions can be supported through human resources. It would not have been an effective decision to restructure 14 classes to make 13 classes to allow a nurture teacher to be in place. Increased class sizes can have an impact on attainment, therefore 14 classes remain for the session 23-24, with all teachers now class committed or delivering Non-Class Contact Time which is a legal requirement.

It is our intention to have some nurture sessions on a Friday for identified pupils, making the best possible use of the resources we have available. This will be fully discussed with staff during the Inset day on Monday 13th November, 2023 to support a plan moving forward.

WATER IN SCHOOL

As a health promoting school we follow North Lanarkshire Council's policy which encourages pupils to drink water in class. Some parents/carers have highlighted that their child does not like water but this is the only drink that is permitted in class during learning time. Fizzy drinks are not permitted in school at all. Through discussion with our Pupil Representatives in Primary 7, they feel that children who do not like water can access diluting juice or flavoured water during the day but this would be at the teacher's discretion as this would greatly impact on children's learning if they were leaving the class too often.
