Numeracy & Mathematics

Numeracy Focus: Addition

Addition strategies Covered: Counting on and counting back. Ask someone at home to come up with an addition sum within 20 (13 + 3, 12 + 6, etc). Try to calculate the answer mentally. Have a discussion explaining how you got your answers- 'I started at 13 and counted on 3' **OR** 'I started at 6 and counted back to 12'.

Mathematic Focus: Shape.

In school we have been looking at 2D and 3D shapes. Can you pick 5 items from home and then identify the shape? Can you count how many sides each shape has?

Optional Challenge: We have started learning how to identify the properties of 3D shapes.

Can you find any shapes around your home and identify the properties? (Faces and vertices)

Spelling:

<u>Learning across the Curriculum</u>

Topic: Ancient Egyptians

Can you use resources around the house to create an Ancient Egyptian pyramid? You could draw a pyramid or use junk cardboard to create one.

Modern Languages: French

Can you say 'Hello' and 'How are you?' in French. You can ask someone at home to ask you how you are to answer too.

P1-3 Spelling Strategies

The strategies the children are taught are:

- Using Phoneme Knowledge (sounding out)
- Syllabification breaking words down into syllables. The children can clap out words to identify syllables e.g. go-ing/An-drew
- Word Shape Look at letter shape, size, ascending and descending letters.
- Tricky Letters Looking at the position of tricky letters as an aid to spelling.
- Compound Words Breaking the compound word into simple words e.g. into makes in and to.
- Mnemonic using an aide memoire e.g. because - Big Elephants Can Add Up Sums Easily
- Using Analogy If you know how to spell one word you can spell similar words e.g. if you can spell hill, you can spell mill, will, fill etc.

P1-3 Word Attack Strategies

- Look at the first letter
- Sound out the first few letters
- Break the word into syllables
- Look at the last letters
- Read the sentence again
- Look at the picture
- Look at the shape of the word

P1-3 Phoneme (sound) Methodology

Individuals will explore a list of words with the phoneme. They will be encouraged to say the words, make/break it, read it out loud and write the word. Children use the diagram below to support this in class.
