

It enables young people to be able to learn new things. Some of our pupils this term will be participating in the Mini Duke and Junior Duke challenges with Mrs Patrick, which prepares them for the next stage in high school - Duke of Edinburgh Award. We wish

them well with their project and look forward to them sharing their experiences with the rest of the school.
