Numeracy & Mathematics

Numeracy Focus: Addition

Activity: <u>Study Ladder</u>- There are activities, games and tutorial videos assigned in the addition pod. In class, we have been looking at adding one more and two more. We will move on to look at number bonds to 5 and 10.

Mathematic Focus - Time

Activity: In the next few weeks, we will look at time passing. We will use timers to help children understand time duration. Ask your child to complete different activities within a minute (60 seconds)- star jumps, hops, etc.

Optional Extra: The class have been looking at O'clock representations on an analogue and digital cloak. Try to incorporate the use of clocks into everyday routines. 'At 5 O'clock we need to leave for swimming.' Can you tell me when it is 5 O'clock?

<u>Literacy</u>

Spelling:

Your spelling words will be in your homework jotter and updated weekly. Choose an activity from the active spelling grid to practise your words. Use your words to write a sentence.

Phonics:

Study Ladder videos, games and worksheets provided for each sound covered this month.

Reading:

Read your school reading book every night. Try to spot any familiar letters or words that we have been learning in class. Optional Challenge: Word hunt- Ask an adult to pick a work from your book. You have to find it and tell them the page number. Remember to return the book to school each day.

Writing:

We are writing with increasing independence. Ask an adult to say some cvc words and you write them down (pig, dog, cat, red, car, zip, etc). **Optional Challenge:** Ask an adult to say a simple sentence and you copy it down one work at a time. (i.e. I am a cat. The dog is red. My frog is sad.)

P1-3 Spelling Strategies

Please note - the P1 children are only beginning to learn these strategies so wont yet be familiar with them all

The strategies the children are taught are:

- Using Phoneme Knowledge (sounding out)
- Syllabification breaking words down into syllables. The children can clap out words to identify syllables e.g. go-ing/An-drew
- Word Shape Look at letter shape, size, ascending and descending letters.
- Tricky Letters Looking at the position of tricky letters as an aid to spelling.
- Compound Words Breaking the compound word into simple words e.g. into makes in and to.
- Mnemonic using an aide memoire e.g.
 because Big Elephants Can Add Up Sums
 Easily
- Using Analogy If you know how to spell one word you can spell similar words e.g. if you can spell hill, you can spell mill, will, fill etc.

P1-3 Word Attack Strategies

Please note - the P1 children are only beginning to learn these strategies so wont yet be familiar with them all



- Look at the first letter
- Sound out the first few letters
- Break the word into syllables
- Look at the last letters
- Read the sentence again
- Look at the picture
- Look at the shape of the word

P1-3 Phoneme (sound) Methodology

*Please note - the P1 children are only beginning to learn this process so will not yet be able to do this method independently

Individuals will explore a list of words with the phoneme. They will be encouraged to say the words, make/break it, read it out loud and write the word. Children use the diagram below to support this in class.
