The children have voted for their next topic and the winning votes were for Ancient Egypt.

As part of this topic we will;

research ancient Egyptian inventions and evaluate the way that they have impacted on Scottish society.

- investigate ancient Egypt's location in history in relation to other civilisations.
- compare and contrast the way that the River Nile was used in Egypt to how rivers in Scotland are used today.
- research and create job descriptions for some of the jobs people had in ancient Egypt and compare them to modern day jobs.
- independently research aspects of ancient Egyptian life and compare and contrast them with my own.
- explore the way that climate and the physical environment impacted on the growth of crops.

#### Numeracy and Mathematics



Numbers: Patterns and Relationships, this will involve investigating different patterns and extending sequences. We will also be looking at function machines and using formula. We will also be completing work on percentages.

Money and Measure: This term the class will investigate different measurements, grams/kilograms, litres/millilitres, mm/cm/m/km. They will take part in practical activities where they will convert between different measurements. They will look at area and perimeter for both regular and irregular shapes, including triangles. We will also look at budgeting

#### Literacy and Languages



**Listening and Talking**: Debate skills which will tie in with discursive writing.

Reading: We are continuing to read both Jammy Dodgers on the Run and Pattern of Secrets.

Non-fiction block, working on inference and identifying main themes.

**Writing:** Discursive & Explanation **Grammar:** Prefixes & suffixes

Punctuation: Continuing with complex punctuation.

Phonics & Spelling: Continuing with NL word lists, looking at prefixes and suffix word families. IDL will also continue.

Modern Languages: Children will be working on writing more French to consolidate previous learning.

# Balmalloch Primary School Home Learning Tasks - P7/6 - Term 4

Every child **must do** reading homework every night for 15-20 minutes; aim to read whole chapters at a time.

- Include: reading on your own, with a brother or sister, being read to by an adult or listening to an audio book.
- Below are additional activities that with your parents/guardians you can discuss and complete if you choose do so:

Be a responsible citizen by helping your parent/guardian around the house - without being asked - remember this includes keeping your own room tidy! Can you find small ways to help the planet in your own home? e.g. switch off lights, re-cycle, have a shower instead of a bath.

Revise maths and/or literacy skills that you need to work on. Use the websites at the bottom of this page to help. Can you challenge yourself to a daily SuDuko puzzle to develop your higher order thinking skills? Try Wordle too.

Visit Kilsyth Library and choose a book you wouldn't normally read. It might be a different author or genre. Write a review. Would you try this genre again? In what way is it different from your usual books?

Practise ball skills against a wall and with a partner. Use left hand, right hand and both hands. Can you add a tennis/badminton racket?

Have a look at clocks around your house. How many are 12h and how many are 24h? Can you convert the times? Look at the time when you start something and check the time when you finish. How long did it take?
