

Health and Wellbeing

The Health and Wellbeing Wheel at the front of this newsletter is what all services use to achieve the best outcomes for your child. Working in partnership with you, health services and businesses will ensure this. This month we are looking at <u>Active</u> and how this contributes to the development of your child. A child who experiences success and improves upon their last attempts, feels more positive.



Every child has the right to be active. Having opportunities to take part in activities such as play, recreation and sport, which contribute to healthy growth and development, at home, in school and in the community. As well as sports, we have been looking at ways to increase our activity ensuring

we are active for 60 minutes a day. We are walking, jogging and running a daily mile in school. Sometimes the weather may stop us from doing things at home that we normally enjoy such as walking and running. When this happens, encourage your child to set a timer and jump on the spot for 3 minutes, skip for 3 minutes, run up and down the stairs for 3 minutes. It soon builds up!

Wellbeing Survey

All schools have been asked to administer a survey to pupils in P5-7 to help plan ahead for children's services in the future. You will have received a leaflet explaining the purpose of this and notification that you had ten days to contact the school if you did not want your child to take part in this.

Pupil House Groups

We have started to develop House Groups at Banton Primary to add an element of competition with a points system. We will have three groups who will receive individual points and group points. These will be counted each week and the winning house will earn an extra playtime. The house who wins the most points throughout the term will get an additional reward.

Mrs Rae has been working with pupils to agree house names. We are looking for something that is about Banton and the local area. Pupils have come up with the names of flowers because we plant these and support the Banton Flower Show. We have also been asking visitors and members of the community what they think. Have you any ideas? Please share these with us.

Severe Weather

I was impressed by how many pupils and staff made it to school during the snow last week. Thank you to Mr Johnston and support staff for 'holding the fort' while others arrived. A parent helper even stayed to help out. Thank you. Mrs Bowe, our part-time janitor/cleaner worked really hard to clear a pathway from the front door of the school to the car park gates as she was trying to provide a safe path for pupils alighting from the bus or a taxi. The shortest pathway is from the school door to the pedestrian gate and in future this will be the only pathway that is cleared as per our Severe Weather Arrangements Newsletter. We will be asking taxis/bus to collect pupils from this gate during severe weather. I have also instructed Mrs Bowe not to open the back gate as per Severe Weather Newsletter. This is to prevent any risk that can be associated with a pathway not being cleared. I apologise for any inconvenience caused on Friday by the shortest pathway not being cleared.
