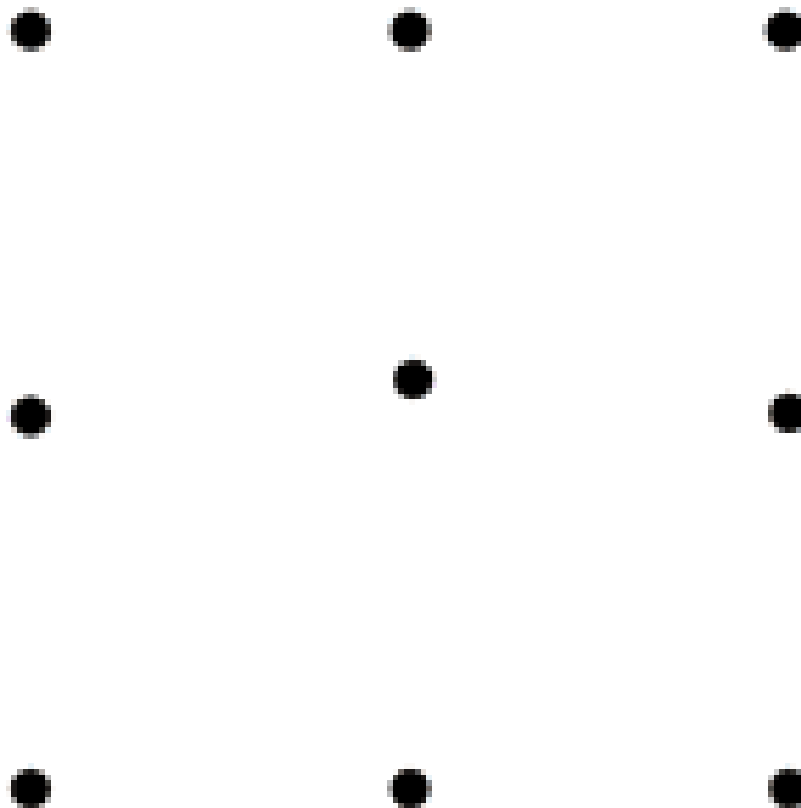

but it is possible!!

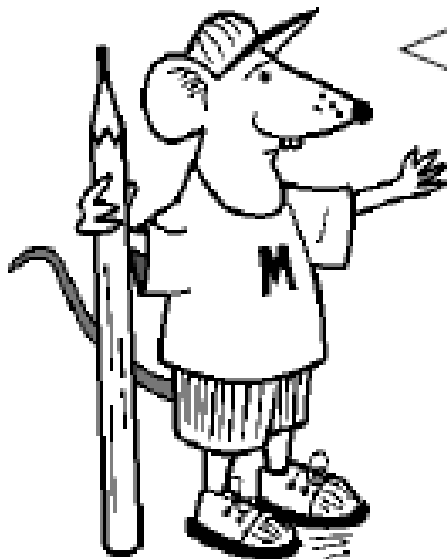
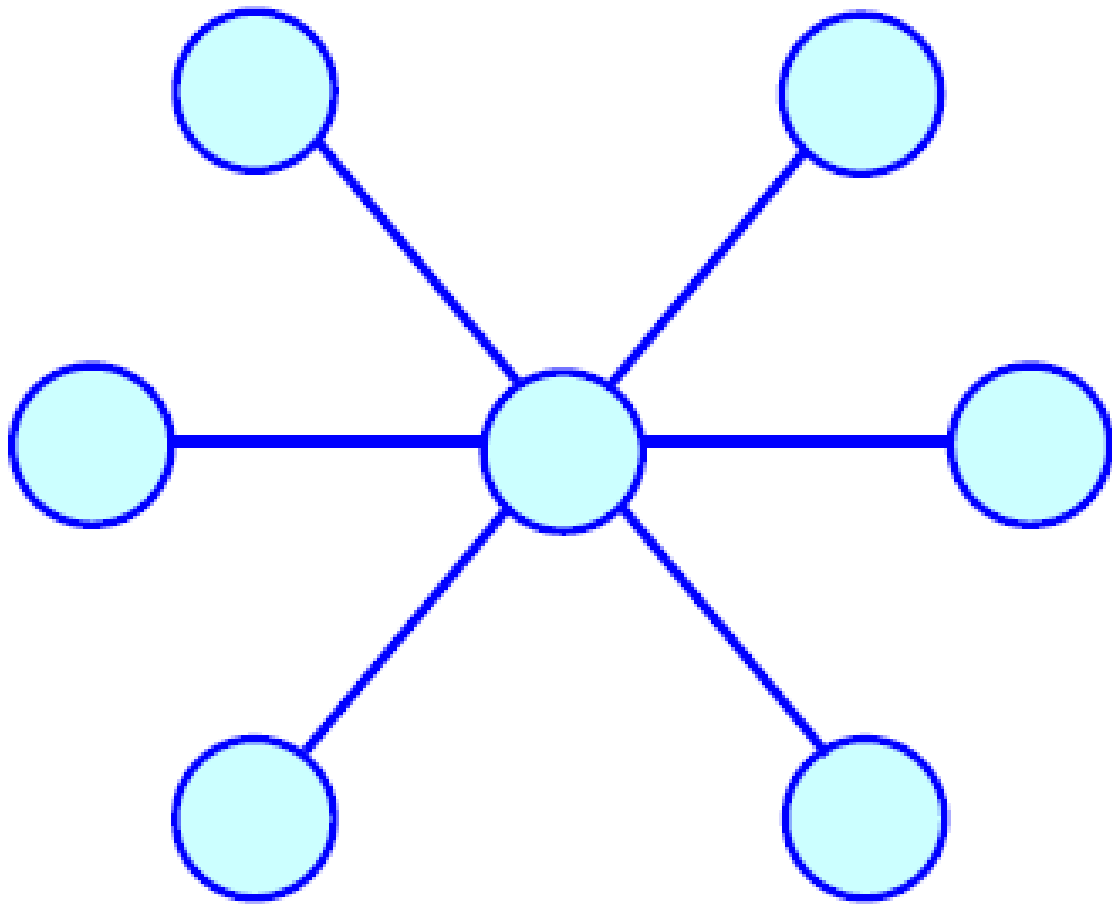


Can you join all nine dots
