You have to rap it up, in winter that's that.

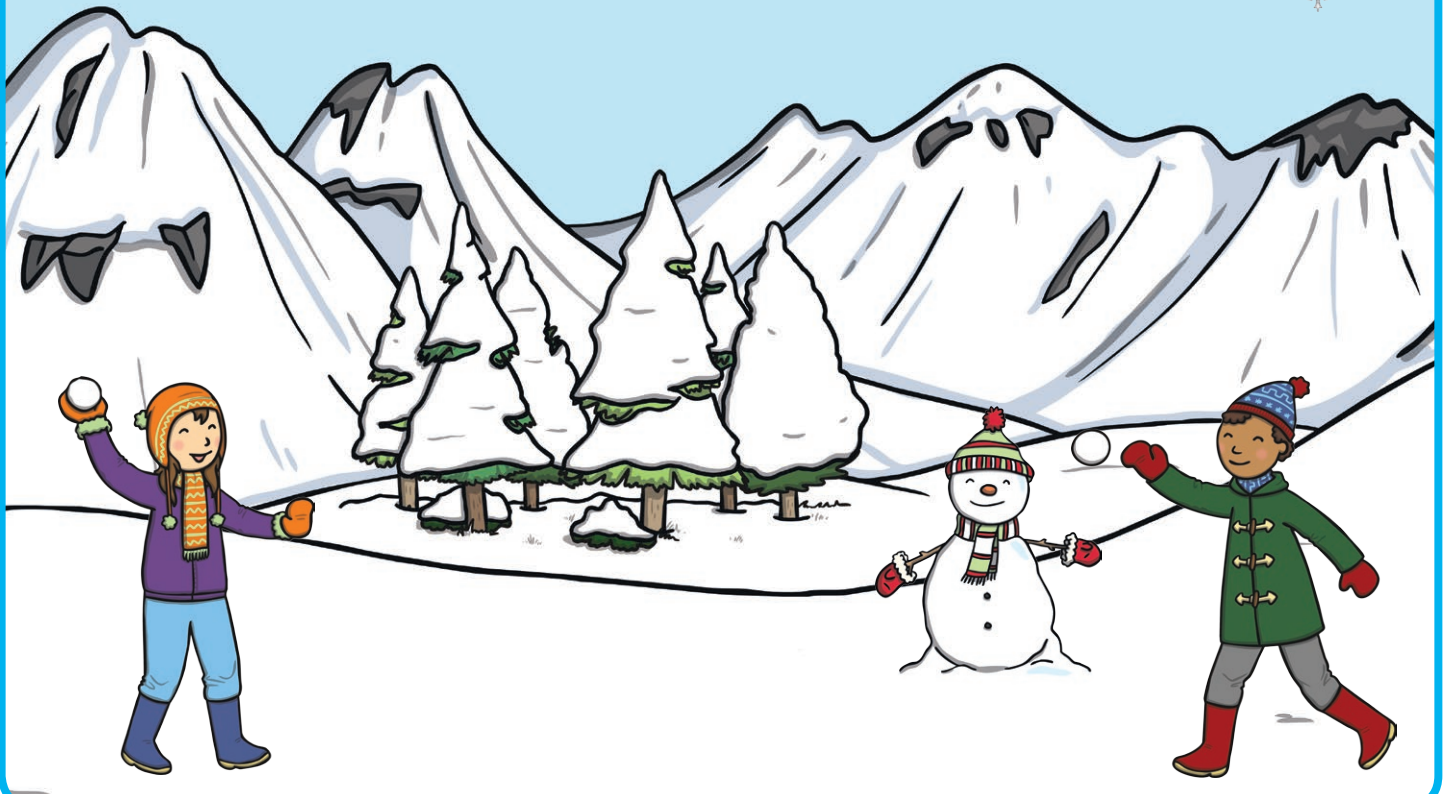
Keep your head warm with a decent hat,
