Week 5

Assessing our work is very useful and important way of helping us to improve our work and helping us to be better learners. Below are some different ways that you can self-assess your work over the course of the week.

Task 1- Read over your work/answers. Look at the success criteria and tick if you think you have achieved it or X if you have not yet achieved it. Then in the column that says evidence select a part/sentence/word or phrase that shows you have achieved that success criteria.

Task 3- Read over your work/answers. Look at the success criteria and **colour each of the boxes** either **Green for Good** if you have achieved it or **Pink for Think** if you have not yet achieved it. (Don't worry if you don't have those colours you can just write G or P) There should be at least one **Pink for Think**, a next step, something you can work on.

Success Criteria	
Identify the unfamiliar word.	
State what it could mean.	
Use the appropriate strategy to help come to the meaning.	
Use clues from the text to help work out meaning and develop understanding.	

Now that you have identified your **Pink for Think** explain how you think you **could improve** this next time.

Task 4-

- Then **using the success criteria**, assess what you have written for this task write down 2 things you have done well- **Green for Good** and 1 thing that you think you can improve on next time- **Pink for Think**.
- **Use the comments below to help you.**
- If you can **highlight the good parts in your work** that show you have met the success criteria in **green**.
- And **highlight in pink** the **areas** that you think **need to be improved**.
