Ongoing Biology Situation

Head of the Science Department, Mrs Crosbie, was invited and attended our meeting with a view to explaining the situation with biology in the school, how the situation came to be and what steps are being/have been put in place to best help the current S4 classes who are the worst affected.

Last year the current S4 class had a trainee teacher, it was later discovered that this teacher had not covered what was expected over the year - when Mrs Carson took over in August of this year it was apparent how far behind they were. This problem was then compounded by the authority not providing sufficient cover / replacements for the department where 1 teacher was retiring and the other going on maternity leave - in short from 2 full time teachers to one 0.6 teacher. Steps were put in place to cover as many classes as possible with the help of 2 retired teachers providing part time support. This still left 1 S4 biology class with a teacher for only 2 of their 4 periods. In October Miss Darragh stepped in to cover these periods however her position as a depute meant she could not always provide this cover or not for the full 2 periods. This had a further impact on pupils who already started the year behind.

S4 biology results in the National 5 prelims were not good, although it was explained that the commercial paper bought in for this prelim was particularly tricky.

Going forward to the exams Mrs Crosbie herself will be taking the 4F biology class for the 2 periods Mrs Carson is unable (not one of her working days).

Some ready written notes have been sourced which will assist in pushing on through the topics still to be covered. An order has been put in for 'How to pass National 5 Biology' books, it is hoped these will be received and distributed to the pupils next week. Study leaflets 'Six Strategies for Effective Learning' have also been produced and will be given out. (These were handed out to all present at this meeting). Both Mrs Crosbie and Mrs Carson will be available for assistance during study leave (as they are any lunchtime) and Top up Workshops will also be run during this time - these will be topic specific where the pupils can come in and have extra tuition on the topics they are having most difficulty with.

An assignment, completed in class, also forms part of the National 5 assessment, evrything possible will be done to help the pupils achieve the best results as this counts for up to 20% of their marks. The department has worked well on this in previous years with most pupils achieving 14-19%.

It was also explained that for this year if a National 5 exam is failed, assuming all unit assessments for National 4 have been passed (these will be sat during study leave to allow all remaining time to be spent on teaching) then in a reprint in September the pupils will get awarded the National 4 pass.

We very much appreciated Mrs Crosbie's time and it is accepted that the school has found itself in a very difficult position which it had no way of anticipating or preventing and that everything possible is being done to assist the current S4s leading up to their May exams. Mrs Horn will return from maternity leave easing the situation somewhat after summer.
