Medicine

Highers: Applicants are required to achieve AAAAA or AAAABB by the end of S5 at the first sitting, including Chemistry and Biology, and either Maths or Physics. Applicants must have English at either Grade 2 Standard Grade or an Intermediate 2. It is acceptable to take Biology/Chemistry/Maths or Physics as a crash Higher in S6 provided Grades AAAAA or AAAABB are achieved by the end of S5. A minimum of Grade B would be required in any crash Higher subject studied in S6. Biology and Human Biology are considered as equal subjects.

Medicine is also available via Aberdeen University, Edinburgh University, Dundee University and St Andrews University and their entry requirements will probably be similar to what is quoted for Glasgow.

NB: Entry requirements quoted are not necessarily up to date and you should always check exact requirements with the Universities or Colleges.

• All volunteers in NHS Lanarkshire go through the same recruitment process.

All potential volunteers complete a <u>registration form</u> and supply the names and addresses of two character references.

We then meet up for a chat about what you are looking for from your volunteering opportunity and complete paperwork for an enhanced disclosure.

You will also need to undergo an Occupational Health check.

This process should take about six to eight weeks.
