In response to feedback from the committee we arranged the following presentations at meetings in the past year — Pupil Support Role Angela Buchanan, Managing Bullying Behaviour Monica Darragh, Police Scotland Gail Nicol and Chris Gray, MVP Programme Elaine Byrne and last but not least Study Skills by Nicola Stirling, Tori Frew and Myren MacPhee.

This year saw our first ever Cluster Parent Council meeting. The idea for this stemmed from visits made to our local primary schools the previous year and evolved into the idea of getting everyone together. Invitations went to parents council within the cluster and included St Pats as well. The event was a success with parents attending from all schools in the cluster. Spotlight Shotts and New College Lanarkshire attended and ran some sessions for the event and since this partnership Spotlight Shotts have been actively involved with young people at Calderhead. Calderhead hosted this cluster event and the PC committee supported this meeting alongside or elected members, John Robertson and our School Captains. In light of this we have a date in the diary for our next Cluster event which is February 2025 to focus on MVP.

There has been continued involvement with the PCG. The Parent Consultative Group are chairs of parent councils who meet throughout the year to hear from council officers within North Lanarkshire Council and parent council peers to share best practice. This has been useful in many ways and has been a productive way of putting Calderhead on the map in respect of us having a voice and presence at these meetings.

We have been involved in revising the NLC Parental Engagement strategy over the past two years. This was presented to committee in May 2024 where the policy was approved and adopted by NLC. It is hoped that this will be a working document / policy rather than just a paper exercise.

William Collum who previously headed up parental engagement in North Lanarkshire heard about our cluster project and offered the opportunity to present this to the parent consultative group. It was a great opportunity to share best practice and showcase the great work that goes on at Calderhead. Some of these ideas have now been adopted by other groups and I expect we will see cluster events developing across North Lanarkshire.

Calderhead were invited to take part in North Lanarkshire's thematic inspection in October this year. This involved inspectors meeting with HT's,



council officers and chairs of parent council across North Lanarkshire to understand their experiences at local authority level.

Audra MacPhee thanked all parent members for their attendance and support at meetings and events. Special mention was made of a valuable member of our group, Maxine Paterson who has been missing from our meetings. We would like to wish Maxine the very best and hope that we will see her back soon. Thanks to our elected members for their support. Thanks to Lynn Prentice for the work she puts into the role of secretary on top of her day job and other roles she has within our community. Special thanks to John Robertson for his support as advisor to the parent council and the inclusive dynamic that we have at Calderhead.

Staffing

Mhari Henderson Acting PT Future Fridays has made a positive start We currently have a number of people in Acting Positions that will be permanently filled once the NLC Management Review has been completed.

We are interview on Monday 9th December from across NLC for an Acting DHT 1FTE to take on the role vacated by the above retiral.

Management Review 2024/2025

At the last management review in 2019/2024 because our school had increased significantly were awarded more management points. Due to management savings imposed by NLC then lost nearly of these new additional points. This meant we were unable to grow the management team in line with the 25% increase in pupil numbers. In the current review, due to the increased school role we have gained a significant number of management points. The school role has increased from 377 pupils in 2016 to 567 pupils in 2024, a rise of 50.4%. As such the current SLT have a working model of a Senior Leadership team of HT, DHT S1&2, DHT S3&S4, DHT S5&^. Each member would also have significant strategic and operational responsibilities. The reason this is a working model is that it is likely that each promoted post within the school will need to be job sized,



which in turn may change the nature of management points they are allocated.

Throughout this process I am working closely with the Acting HT in waiting. **ICT Provision**

We are investing in 37 new laptop computers. Thirty-two will have been allocated to Social Subjects and five to the library. This will bring the numbers of new laptops in the library to 20.

Self-Evaluation

As well as the NLC Attainment review carried out by our Education and Families Manager we also invited Lewis Paterson, Professional INSIGHT Advisor to look at our attainment data. We then had a rich two-hour session with him going through our data in detail. Lewis offered a three key pieces of advice,

- 1. we need to ensure all pupils gain awards this would drive up the attainment for the lower attaining 20% of our pupils.
- 2. we need to ensure that pupils in S4 sit as many National 5 or Level 5 awards as possible.
- 3. we need to convert S4 National 5/Level 5 awards to Level 6 or Higher passes.

All three depend heavily on improving pupil attendance.
