UNCRC (Article 24) 'Children have the right to good quality health care, to clean water, nutritious food and a clean environment, so that they will stay healthy'.

UNCRC (Article 27) 'Children have a right to a standard of living that is good enough to meet their physical and mental needs'.

What is child poverty?

Poverty is understood as 'not having enough' to afford the basic necessities needed for a decent standard of living. In Scotland, a young person is understood to be living in poverty when they are living in a household that earns less than 60% of the average income (average income typically £25,200). Across Scotland, almost one in four children are officially recognised as living in poverty.

Pupil Equity Funding

We want every child to have the best chance to succeed, no matter their background. This means removing any barriers that might get in the way of learning and making sure all children feel healthy, happy, and included.

Inclusion isn't just about sitting near other children or completing a worksheet—it's about creating a caring and supportive environment where every child feels valued. We think about the whole child, not just what happens in the classroom. This includes understanding any extra needs they may have, their physical and emotional wellbeing, family circumstances, and cultural background. By doing this, we can give each child the support they need to thrive.

What is Calderhead High School doing to tackle child poverty and increase equity?

Little Shop of Happiness

- We have created a uniform recycling bank to help all families access uniform and reduce waste
- Young people can also access pre-loved clothing
- We provide free sanitary/hygiene products for all pupils

Health and Nutrition

- Breakfast club is on every day to offer a nutritious breakfast to all pupils and this is supported by Greggs
- This year we are creating a foodbank for young people to access and this winter we will deliver food parcels to our families who require support

Technical and Home Economics Money

- The cost of materials and food supplies in technical and Home Economics are covered for all students
- We assist parents to apply for NLC financial inclusion grants/ free school meals/ benefits/ clothing grants

Experiences and attainment

- Clubs are available every day to all pupils.
- School trips are subsidised for identified pupils.
- We provide access to ICT
- All classrooms are equipped with essential learning materials specific to each subject to reduce cost.

- Creating a Cost of School Day section on the school website with relevant information and links.
