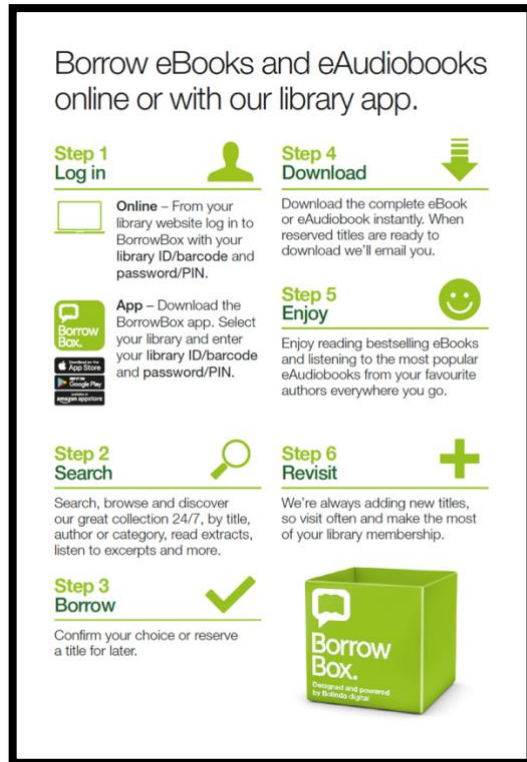

CultureNL Libraries: There are some fantastic resources available from the public library. If you have not joined the Library yet, you can join online

at <https://libraries.culturenl.co.uk> and get instant access to eBooks, audiobooks, eMagazines and online information sources. It's really easy to join and they will send you a Library card number which you can use to access their Borrowbox – you can use this to download the books onto your device. See the image below for more information about Borrowbox. Best of all, you can borrow up to six books at a time, which is enough even for me!

If you already have a library card you only require a password which you can request [online](#).
