

How can you help make the internet a more respectful and safer place for you and your friends?

You are being challenged to work with your teachers or youth worker and others in your class or group to produce a fun way of sharing the message to other children of respecting others and keeping safe on line.

All schools and youth groups in North Lanarkshire are invited to take part in the North Lanarkshire Child Protection Committee Safer Internet Day Challenge.

Your challenge is to produce a communication (e.g. poster, image, gif, cartoon, blog, video, twitter feed, meme or any other ideas) that can help to create a better internet by promoting positive messages about being kind and respectful to others online and protecting your online reputations (and those of others).

You must not use any information or images that would allow any individual to be identified in what you produce, or feature copyrighted images.

The winning entries will feature on the Child Protection Committee webpage and, depending on what the winners produce it might be used for other publicity to promote safer use of the internet.

The winning teams will get a prize of £200 for their class/school/group.

This can be spent on your choice of prize, e.g. a party, school equipment, a day out for the class or to buy something that the class/group needs.

The Challenge is open to Primary, Secondary and SEN/ASN schools and to youth groups with each having their own category.

Only one entry per school/youth club/ centre to be submitted

Max 200 words or 2 minutes or equivalent.

The deadline for submitting entries is 29th March 2018.

Winners will be announced by 30th April 2018.
