Crossing Patrol

Do you want to become a central part of your local community and help North Lanarkshire's children get to and from school safely?

School Crossing Patrollers are urgently required in various locations across the authority.

This job will allow you to play a vital role of ensuring the safety of pedestrians, particularly children, when crossing the road.

The posts range from 7.5 to 13.75 hours a week and patrollers will receive the national living wage.

Homework

We would like to offer our pupils more personalisation and choice with their homework. Some of the usual activities will remain but there will be a grid/table of activities for your child to select from. This is new for Chapelgreen Primary and you may have some questions. Please do not hesitate to contact myself or the class teacher for further clarification. Below is an example of spelling homework.

	Spelling Rules -	Acrostic poem -	<u>Wordsearch -</u>	<u>Computer -</u>
Spelling	Come up with another 6 words that have our spelling rule.	Choose one of your spelling words. Write an acrostic poem for that word.	Make a wordsearch using your spelling words. Words can be horizontal, vertical or diagonal.	Use the computer to type your spelling words. Can you use different fonts, colours and sizes.

Choose <u>one</u> spelling activity from the grid to complete <u>each week</u>. Your child can choose a different activity each week to provide variety. By the end of the term it would be expected that most activities had been attempted.

Some parents worry when a familiar activity is changed that it may not be the best for their child. Ultimately spelling is learning a sequence of letters/sounds that make up the word. Writing words out three times is only a valuable activity if the strategy of 'Look, Say, Cover, Write, Check is used accurately. We all learn differently. Some children will be visual learners and writing the tricky part of the word in a colour, or in fancy letters, might help that children remember what the word looks like.

We would expect, regardless of the activity chosen, that it is completed to a good standard and presented neatly with the date and title.
