What's happening this week?

Monday

Our Active Schools Coordinator came in to speak to our pupils about Race to Rio. This is a fun activity where pupils record their walking on a chart. We will give you more information when we are ready to start it. Ask your child about it.

Tuesday

Primary 1 & 2 pupils are off to Tesco in Craigmarloch to take part in their 'Farm to Fork' project. They will find out about where some of our foods come from. Check our blog later in the week to see how they got on. Pupils from Primary 1 in Banton will also be going.

Wednesday

Active Schools run a number of festivals each year encouraging pupils to take part in fitness activities and sports. There is a football festival (7-asides) at St Patrick's Primary this Wednesday and we have managed to make a team between ourselves and Banton Primary. Although each school has their own football strip I have made the decision for all pupils to wear our strips on this occasion. Our nursery children will have a dress-up day on Friday 30 October. This is a Halloween type occasion but we prefer to keep it low-key because young children can feel quite strange when everyone 'looks different'. Dressing up in usual play clothes, such as people who help us, heroes and heroines will allow everyone to have a lovely morning and no one will be upset by scary masks.

Parent/Carer/Teacher Consultations

When you come into school, please sign in and then enter the hall. You or your child can collect their tray/folders of work for you to have a look at while you are waiting to speak to the teacher. Please return your child's work before leaving the school. Tea and coffee will be available and donations will be welcomed to help cover our costs.

The appointment time lasts for up to ten minutes. It is important to keep within the time allocation to prevent delays for other parents. Some parents like to involve their child in the consultation but I would prefer, on this occasion that your child remains in the waiting area inside the hall.

I will be in the hall too and would be happy to answer any questions you might have or even show you how to access and comment on our blog. I am hoping some of our Parent Council members will also be available to tell you about the good work they do and how you could help.

Nursery News

Welcome

We would like to welcome our new Early Learning Practitioner Ms Claire Macpherson who is covering for Mrs McTaggart. I'm sure you will make her feel very welcome.

Play on Pedals

All the nursery staff will be attending training this week on a project called 'Play on Pedals'. This will help staff support your child as they learn to go a 2-wheeler bike. We will get a balance bike and helmets plus access to a set of bikes when we are working with our children. This is fantastic and funded by NLC. Mrs Henderson will attend training on Wednesday, Ms Macpherson on Thursday and Mrs Tang on Friday.

Parent/Carer Nursery Workshop

There will be the second of our parent/carer workshops this Friday starting at 11.15am. The next two will take place on Friday 6 Nov and Friday 20 November. Please come along. The meeting is very informal and you can get some helpful ideas to use with your child/ren as well as a chance to meet some of the other parents.

Can you help?

We have been working hard with the children to tidy our outdoor play area and would like to start growing herbs, and planning some other exciting areas for the children to explore. We need some help to re-establish/fix our plots and move some pots. Would anyone have an hour or so to spare? As the nursery children are only in on mornings then any afternoon would be ideal. Please speak to the nursery staff if you are able to help.

We would also like to start using our Family Fun Bags which have a story and some activities and a game. To do this, we would need a helper to check the bags when they return to make sure everything is there and replace any sheets before re-issuing. This would probably need one hour per week for a set period of time. You would need to get a PVG check to be in the nursery at the same time as the children. Please speak to the nursery staff if you are interested.

Parent Council

I had sent out a text message letting everyone know when the Parent Council meeting was taking place. Some of you expressed an interest in this but weren't sure because your child hadn't started school. I mentioned this at the last parent council meeting and they have requested that I invite you again to join them and we would add nursery items to the agenda. <u>Safety</u>



Please remember to use the pedestrian gate when entering and leaving the school/nursery building. When your child no longer needs to be brought into the playground we need to know they are able to come in the correct gate, away from the car park. Please support us with this and set our children a good example. Thank you.

<u>Reminder!</u>

I thought it might be helpful to explain some of the procedures we use in school and nursery to help us work in partnership.

What should I do when my child will be off school/nursery?

If your child is unable to come to school/nursery, we would appreciate a phone call as soon as possible but before 9.20am. If your child doesn't attend school/nursery we will contact you to check your child is safe. North Lanarkshire has very clear guidelines for absence monitoring. As Head Teacher I may need to speak to you about your child's absence record, which can also include late-coming.

Do I need to send in a note if my child is absent?

Even though you have spoken to us about why your child is absent, <u>we still need a</u> <u>note</u> telling us when your child was absent and the reason for this. For example, 'Jemima was off school on Mon 19.10.15 because she was unwell.'



Please note, in line with advice from Health Services, children who are absent due to sickness and diarrhoea should not return to nursery/school until there have been no episodes of sickness or diarrhoea for 48 hours.

My child has an appointment/I have an appointment, what do I do?

Pupils often miss part of their day at school to attend appointments. It would be very helpful if you could <u>send in a note or phone the school office</u> to let them know when the appointment is and when you will be collecting your child. This will help us to get your child ready on time. If possible, please try to make appointments after the school day so your child is not missing their teaching and learning time. If you have an appointment which makes it difficult to collect your child at home time please try to plan ahead and make an arrangement, if possible for another family member to collect your child or choose a more suitable time.

After-School Clubs

I am delighted to say that some of our staff and the After-Schools Coordinators have organised clubs for children to attend after school. Your child may come home with a letter saying they are interested in joining a club. The letter will tell you the times and date of the club and any special requirements. This usually consists of a PE kit or Outdoor Clothing and a bottle of water. Please return the permission slip as soon as possible.

- Fundamentals for P1-3 will begin this Friday from 3-4pm. We would expect that every child will be collected by an adult at 4pm.
- Athletics for Pr5-7 beginning on Thursday 29th October at 3pm. The permission slip asks you to let us know if you are collecting your child or if they can walk home.
- Netball for P4-5 on Wednesday 28th October at 3pm. This information has still to be confirmed.

Contact Details

It is your responsibility to keep the school/nursery informed about any change of details. This might be a change of address, or a new/temporary mobile phone number. We need to be able to contact you if your child is unwell, or in severe weather when there may be an early closure. Thank you.

Home Time Arrangements

Sometimes arrangements need to be changed, especially at the end of the day if you are held up. Try to contact the school before 2.45pm to give us time to pass your message on. Prepare your child about what they should do if you are not there. For example, we would always say that if no one was there to collect you at home time, always come back into the school.'
