Spelling Strategy 1Sounding Out

 I can use Elkonin Boxes and the Diacritical Marking Spelling Code to help me to break words into individual sounds so I can sound words out.

Spelling Strategy 2-Syllabification

I can break words into syllables.
I know that each syllable will contain a vowel.

i.e. going= go + ing

Spelling Strategy 3-

Words within Words

 I can find smaller words that are hidden inside a word.
i.e.- country = <u>count</u> <u>try</u>

Spelling Strategy 4-Compound Word

 I can find two (or sometimes more) words that are put together to make new words.
i.e.- football= foot + ball

Spelling Strategy 5-

Use an Analogy

 I can use my knowledge of words and sounds to help me spell other words with the same sound. i.e.- if I know light, I can spell bright.

Spelling Strategy 6-

Use a Mnemonic

 I can create my own memory aid to help me remember words with tricky spelling.

i.e.- could - **o u l d**oh you lucky duck

Spelling Strategy 7-

Use the Spelling Rule

 I can learn specific spelling rules.

i.e.- 'i' before 'e' except after 'c' brief - ceiling

Spelling Strategy 8-

One Syllable Words

 With single syllable words, I can double the consonant before adding an ending that starts with a vowel.

e.g.- drop becomes dropped
