## Creating a Plot using a Story Mountain

All stories tend to follow the same plot structure.

The plot is what happens in a story. The structure is the way a story is written.

This structure is sometimes known as a story mountain.

- Watch the clip first <u>Clip</u>
- Draw your own story mountain or use the worksheet.

## Remember to include:

Hook - The hook is the introduction. This is where the author introduces the characters and setting of the story.

<u>Problem</u>- The problem or conflict is what the story will mostly be about. The author usually introduces the problem early in the story. <u>Rising Action</u>- The rising action are the two or three events that help the reader understand the problem or conflict going on in the story. <u>Climax</u>- The climax is the most exciting part of the story. It is usually the big event you won't forget.

**Falling Action**- The falling action are one or two events that happen after the climax. These events lead up to the solution of the problem. **Resolution**- The resolution usually happens at the end. This is where the main problem or conflict gets solved.

If you cannot think of your own plot, choose a story you know well to make a story mountain.
