Dear Parent/Carer,

As always, I hope this letter finds you, your family and your loved ones safe and well. First and foremost, thank you for all of your support, patience and understanding throughout what has proved to be a challenging term. I am very proud of the way in which our school community has dealt with the continuously changing contexts and we should all be justifiably proud of what we have all managed to achieve. As parents and families, your support has been inspiring for us throughout and it has also provided us with much of the energy required. Our young people (your children) have been absolutely first class in the way that they have responded to and overcome each challenge and I will be forever grateful to them and our school staff for how they have adapted and delivered such support for our young people.

In my most previous letter, I wrote that I was very much looking forward to a number of things as we embraced our blended learning model from the 15th March. Following on from that, I can tell you how wonderful it has been to have our young people back in school filling the corridors and classrooms full of laughter, chatter and positive learning again — I have very much missed that and I personally feel that I have found another spring in my step over the last few weeks. It has felt much more like Chryston High School again. In my most recent email, I mentioned that my personal opinion was that young people did indeed need to 'catch up' but only on the most important things — these being, connecting with their friends again, contributing successfully to their communities again and embracing the opportunities that being back in school provides. I am also very keen to reiterate that I think that due to COVID19 circumstances, our young people will actually be ahead of other generations in so many ways, including, being highly skilled in digital learning, being resilient and becoming successful independent life-long learners — skill-sets that are all so important in the world we will be living in for generations to come. I am very proud of each and every one of them.

Return to School - Monday 19th April

I am anticipating that following further, upcoming Scottish Government announcements that all young people will return to school again on Monday 19th April at our normal time of 8.55am, following our Easter/Spring holidays. We are very much looking forward to welcoming all young people back to school for our final term of the school session. If there are any unexpected changes/amendments required between now and our return, I will of course be in contact with our school community. From the 19th April, all young people will follow their normal/original timetable, beginning with week A arrangements.

Staying Safe in Chryston High School

From term 4 (Monday 19th April), there is no requirement for 2m distancing between pupils. Adults will still maintain a 2m distance between themselves and other adults, and themselves and pupils, where possible.

Similar to before Christmas, young people should enter and exit our building as follows:

S1 & S6 Main Entrance

S2 & S5 Entrance at Home Economics









S3 & S4 Entrance at Maths/Humanities

End of Day Young people will exit via the nearest exit point (with staggered arrangements in place where necessary)

Staggered arrangements will be considered and arranged appropriately throughout the school day to support safe travel from one area of the school to another. We will return to our original week A/week B timetable as set out at the beginning of the session in August, beginning with week A from Monday 19th April.

Young people are asked to arrive at school as close to 8.55am as possible every day and use our outside space around the building on arrival/during social times throughout the day as far as possible. Due to returning in the summer term, using outside space should be more comfortable due to improving weather conditions (fingers crossed) and therefore, it is likely that staff will encourage that to be the case as appropriate. Year group specific social areas/arrangements continue to be in place and used as necessary (including during inclement weather).

Furthermore, we will all continue to embrace our already established routines such as:

- Using hand sanitiser stations at entrances, exits, around the building and in each classroom
- Keeping left in corridors as we move through the school building
- Using anti-bacterial spray/wipes on workstations in each classroom (clean as you go)
- Extended blocks of learning to further reduce movement around the building (more frequent double periods)
- Physical distancing wherever practically possible in line with Scottish Government guidelines
- Attending in PE kit on days they have PE on their Timetable as changing facilities are currently unavailable
- We also thank our facilities staff (cleaning and janitorial) for their continued work in enhanced cleaning routines

The Scottish Government advice is that face coverings should be worn for:

- all adults and young people in secondary schools at all times except when eating and drinking
- adults, young people and children aged 5 and over are travelling on dedicated school transport

Parents and carers should also wear face coverings for pick up and drop off at school, even if this is outside the school perimeter.

We appreciate that some staff and children and young people will be unable to wear a face covering for good reasons and that position will continue to be respected.

Staff and pupils are strongly encouraged to:

- bring their own face coverings to school and ensure they don't share these with others;
- store these safely in a washable, sealable bag or container when not in use;
- wash reusable face coverings in hot water at the end of each day; and
- safely and hygienically dispose of disposable face coverings after use.

LFD Testing

An additional measure to keep everyone safe is the roll out of LFD testing kits to S1-S3 pupils, thus meaning that they are now available for all young people. Attached to the email that you find this letter you will have access to a consent form and a further information sheet about data protection regarding LFD testing. We have been using this as a school for a

considerable period of time now and we are very positive about the impact that this approach is having and therefore we strongly encourage our young people to engage in regular testing as provided by the school. During the final week of the school holidays, our office team will be in to distribute kits on the following days at the following times:

If you would like to arrange to pick up LFD test kits from the school, S1 and S2 parents can come to the school office at the times above, dependant on the class your son/daughter is in. Parents of S3 pupils have time slots based on alphabetical order by child's surname. Where possible, parents/carers are asked to complete the consent form (emailed) in advance and bring that with them to school when collecting a test kit. Where this is not possible, office staff will provide you with one when you arrive. S1-S3 are all under 16 and therefore, consent and initial pick up must be arranged by parents/carers.

Senior Phase 2021 Alternative Certification Model - May-June Assessment 2021

With the cancellation of SQA exams this session, all senior phase learners are engaged in the Alternative Certification Model. Grades will be determined by class teachers based on evidence collated throughout the session. Throughout the session, teachers have been collating assessment information for young people in the senior phase and as you will already be aware, teachers have been advised by SQA to aim to have between 2-4 robust pieces of learning/assessment evidence for each young person. To help support this further, a senior phase (S4-S6), May-June assessments programme is arranged in CHS from Tuesday 4th May until Wednesday 9th June (inclusive). In accordance with feedback from young people, they will not be expected to sit more than one assessment a day and where possible, assessments will take place in classroom settings. In order to maximise the time for learning and consolidation of learning, there will be no study leave this session. Young people will continue to attend classes as normal according to their timetable. Full details will be issued on our return to school after the spring break once confirmation has been received from the First Minister of the full return of students. Parents views have also been discussed with representatives from our parent council/parent forum – I'd like to take this opportunity to thank them again for their time and very helpful contributions. Pupil views and parent views have been the key part of our planning.

In addition to providing each senior phase learner and family with a fully informative CHS guide to the Alternative Certification Model during w/b Monday 19th April, parents and young people will also receive booklets and information directly to their door from the SQA and as a school we will also plan for parent information (online) opportunities early in the new term.
