WATER HAZARD IN PENTLAND ROAD

I have been contacted on two occasions about the presence of lying ground water in Pentland Road near the school gate and more recently about the fact that it had turned icy. I have contacted the council previously about this and am led to believe that it is some kind of water table issue. However I have contacted them again and have been assured that they will look into it again. I understand that there is a grit bin in place at this location and given that we are coming into the winter, would ask that if you notice the pavement becoming icy that you use the grit provided.

PLAYGROUND UPDATE

I am happy to report that the council have agreed to tarmac the area next to the new huts to provide a waiting area for parents of children who leave school by the Pentland Road gate at three o' clock. In the meantime, parents should continue to wait on the path or just outside the gate at three. If your child leaves by the front gate you should continue to collect them at the designated dots just outside the front gate. If you have older children at the high school collecting younger siblings, I'd ask you to remind them of these arrangements.

The new system is working well but does rely on parents being on time. We understand that sometimes people get held up, if they are running late they can call the school and we can keep the child at reception for pick up.

DOGS IN OR AROUND SCHOOL

I have had a number of calls from parents who are concerned about the presence of dogs around the school gate at the start and end of the day. As you know, I am a big fan of dogs but this is not the case for everyone. Please either carry or keep your dog on a very short lead when dropping or collecting your child from school to avoid any unnecessary upset to anyone.

Could anyone who took a questionnaire home from the Parent Evening please return the completed form to the school. Your comments are important to us and help us to collectively plan for continuous improvement.

PAPERLESS UPDATE



You will be aware that we are currently trying to implement a paperless communication system through email. This is so far proving problematic due to a number of factors. Some people's email addresses are receiving the emails from the school in their junk mail and some are not receiving them at all. I have also sent out paper communications to say we have sent test emails with a tear off slip so that you can let us know if the test email was received or not and there were quite a few not returned. I will do this again before the Christmas holiday, please check your child's bag. It is crucial that you return this simple tick sheet to the school so that we may determine where there are gaps in our communication system.

Sending out paper communication to the whole parent body is very costly and we are looking at ways to save money which could be better spent elsewhere in the school. Your co-operation in this matter is much appreciated.

SCHOOL FUND



We are now collecting school fund on a Friday. We are only looking for loose change, anything from 5p - 50p, and any family with more than one child can just donate once. There is no tracking system for this and it is purely to boost school funds, which are pretty low. We use school funds to supplement in-school events such as the pantomime, school trips, bus costs, etc. Anything you can give is much appreciated. One parent suggested allowing their child to collect pennies in a jar or in a Smarties tube and handing it in when it's full. If your child would prefer to do this then that's fine. I'll let you know how we are getting on with it in the January/February newsletter.

CHRISTMAS CONCERT

The **Christmas 50th Anniversary Concert** will take place on the following dates:

Tuesday 13th December (10am and 6.30pm) Wednesday 14th December (1.15pm).

Each show is expected to last about 90 minutes, and the capacity for each show is 180. Tickets, £3 each, will go on sale between Tuesday 22nd November and Monday 5th December. Tickets will initially be strictly limited to two per family to allow all families a chance to see the show, and will be sold on a first come, first served basis.

On Tuesday 6th December all remaining tickets will go on sale, again on a first come, first served basis. Tickets can be bought from the school hall between 8.45-9.15am on these dates and from the school office after 6th December. Entrance to the hall can be gained from the fire door in the hall on these dates. Tea and coffee will be available at each show and there will also be two small hampers for raffle. There will only be a hot Snack to Go option for lunch on 14th December as we will need to have the hall prepped for the concert in the afternoon.

Christmas Jumper Day is on Friday 16th December. All children should wear a Christmas jumper or T-shirt on that day and can also wear tinsel deelyboppers, etc. if they wish. They each will pay £1, which will go to a range of children's charities, featured on the advert.

We cannot have their party in the evening this year as I cannot ask staff to work two evenings in December due to the Working Time Agreement, and of course it's a busy time of year and they all have families of their own.
