PLAYGROUND

The children are now settled into their new classes and playgrounds and I ask that you again revert back to arrangements from last year re drop off and collection of children.

Pupils in P2-7 should be dropped off and left in the playground where there is adult supervision from 8.40am. Any parents wishing to wait until the bell rings should either wait on the pavement at the back gate on Pentland Road or, where it is felt necessary, on the path leading from Pentland Road to the playground. Please do not stand in the playground area.

At the end of the school day pupils leaving from the Pentland Road gate can be collected on the path or at the back gate. Pupils leaving from the front gate in P2-7 can be collected at the painted dots at the front of the school in the designated area provided.

Pupils have been reminded at assemblies about coming back into the school if there is no one to collect them. Staff remain at the exits after the bell to catch any children who find themselves in this position and a member of the Senior Management Team is at the front gate.

I continue to liaise with NLC about the tarmacked area adjacent to the new huts. I'm assured that the necessary funds are available but that there seems to be some problem retaining a contractor. I assure you that I'll continue to pursue this.

3 O' CLOCK ARRANGEMENTS

The school roll has increased this year and we have slightly fewer staff. May I ask that you ensure your child knows the arrangements for collection at the end of the school day and that you contact the school by phone before two o' clock if alternative arrangements have to be made? The school is very busy from about 2.45 with pupils returning to classes from various pursuits and bus and After-School Club children getting organised.

Last minute phone calls to change arrangements, although sometimes unavoidable, can cause delay in the bus children leaving and can, at times, cause confusion with both the children and staff about where they have to go. This is about ensuring the safety of your children and I ask that, as far as possible, you adhere to these guidelines.

It is of paramount importance that we are able to contact you in an emergency. Please ensure that we have the most up-to-date information and phone numbers. If you change your number or your phone is broken, please ensure that you provide us with an alternative number so that we are able to reach you if we need to.
