COMMUNICATION

Please remember to check your emails regularly as I send communications to you to keep you up to date and remind you of upcoming events. If you are not receiving emails and others are telling you about announcements please contact the school office so that we can rectify this. WINTER WEATHER ARRANGEMENTS

Please ensure that you have read the recent email regarding arrangements in inclement weather. My janitor assures me that he will do everything he can to maintain access to the school but it is possible that the back gate may have to remain closed on occasion, particularly if it is snowing. We all need to be aware of this and plan ahead.

SOCIAL MEDIA

We can continue to cover internet safety in school but please check your child's devices regularly for their online activity to ensure that they are safe and acting responsibly.

P.E. TIMETABLE

Some classes may have disruption to their P.E. routine over the winter as we need to use the hall for show practices, etc. Some classes also have outside P.E. timetabled and this will continue unless the weather is particularly bad. All classes will continue to have at least one hour of P.E., either in the school hall or over at the hall in the Cultural Centre. However, if they are unable to have their second slot due to absence or bad weather, please be assured that we have a virtual system we use in classes and, when needed, the teachers use this for 15 minutes four times a week in addition to their hour of timetabled P.E.

NEW BUILD

Our school roll is currently 332 and I have no further information at this point regarding the new build. Architects visited the school recently and we have been told we will be having another modular unit installed in the playground on the grassed area between the two existing units. This is good news as even when the new build starts, it is certain that we will need further classrooms before our new school is ready.

CHRISTMAS GIFTS

It is common for many of you to give your child's teacher a gift at Christmas. I previously asked that you stop sending gifts in to teachers and other staff as I am aware that it is becoming more and more expensive to do so. All classes have a minimum of two teachers, sometimes three, and also a Support Assistant. If you have more than one child, this can be very expensive. Your gifts are much appreciated but truly unnecessary, a card or letter from your child will more than suffice.

ROAD SAFETY

Please be mindful of our children's safety on the roads by driving carefully when around the school and in the village. I have noticed that people regularly jump the lights at the junction of Lindsaybeg Road and Main Street at the doctors' surgery. I know it might not be parents from the school but, please, just be mindful.

Again, I also remind you about parking. Please park responsibly away from the school, off pavements and away from junctions.

BREAKFAST CLUB

Our Breakfast Club starts at 8.15am. At no time should any child be left in the playground on their own before the doors open. We have also noticed that children are coming in later and later for breakfast. Please ensure that your child is no later than 8.30am so they're able to eat without going into class late and also so that catering staff can get the hall ready for children coming in for P.E. Please remember that the Breakfast Club is for children having breakfast and cannot be used as an early drop off. Anyone attending must pay for and have breakfast.

DOGS AT SCHOOL

You all know my love of dogs but can you please not bring them into the playground, even if they're carried, and ensure that dogs at the back gate are well away from the entrance?

FINANCIAL INCLUSION TEAM (FIT)

I have also attached a leaflet from the Financial Inclusion Team. This is a very expensive time of year and this is a free service that can help anyone experiencing financial hardship. If there's anything we as a school or the FIT team can do, please do not hesitate to contact us.
