

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Welcome to our first 'learning from home' newsletter of the session. After the October week, we hope to move our home learning onto the Glow platform and into Glow teams. It is vital that you check the Glow log in works for your child. Once in Glow, please click the house at the side and then you should see a **Microsoft team** tile. Click on this to see if your child is a member of 2 Glow teams – their stage team NLC Chryston P6 and their class team NLC Chryston Mrs M/Mrs W or Miss Anderson. These two teams should appear. You are not required to do anything except check your child sees these teams and can open them. Your child's teacher's email is there for your child to email the home learning they complete from this newsletter - they can do this via their Glow Outlook. At this point we are only giving out Literacy and English and Numeracy and Mathematics tasks. These are suggested tasks. It is up to you as a parent how many tasks you wish your child do.



Remember that children should only use the staff emails to share their homework with their teacher or ask for clarification of a task.

Numeracy and Mathematics tasks

We continue to keep all classes covering same concepts within each CfE level to support the teaching and learning if we end up learning from home. All Second level P5 -7 pupils are working on subtraction, problem solving and shape until October week.

Here is a list of suggested tasks to do at home to complement the learning in class –

- Mystery Number – Find the missing number to the following questions.
 $1834 - ? = 1522$ $6769 - ? = 2611$ $? - 6321 = 2347$ $? - 3621 = 6313$
- Sumdog week competition – 1000 questions to answer starting 25th September to 1st October
- Maths week is the week beginning 28th September. We'd like the children to enter a national competition. *Maths inside* is a photo competition open to everyone living in Scotland. Three themes to choose from ***in the home & out an' aboot*** and ***complete the pattern*** Details of this can be found at <https://mathsinside.com/>
- DIY Digits – Can you make 4 digit numbers using the digits 1-9, e.g 5982, 2174.
Find sums and differences between the numbers using the formal methods and record this.
Challenge – make larger numbers to add and subtract.
