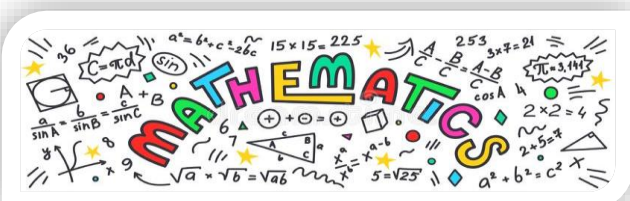

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Welcome to our first 'learning from home' newsletter of the session. After the October week, we hope to move our home learning onto the Glow platform and into Glow teams. It is vital that you check the Glow log in works for your child. Once in Glow, please click the house at the side and then you should see a **Microsoft team** tile. Click on this to see if your child is a member of 2 Glow teams – their stage team NLC Chryston P2 and their class team NLC Chryston Miss Nisbet or Miss Bryden. These two teams should appear. You are not required to do anything except check your child sees these teams and can open them. Your child's teacher's email is there for your child to email the home learning they complete from this newsletter - they can do this via their Glow Outlook. At this point we are only giving out Literacy and English and Numeracy and Mathematics tasks. These are suggested tasks. It is up to you as a parent how many tasks you wish your child do.



Remember that children should only use the staff emails to share their homework with their teacher or ask for clarification of a task.

## Numeracy and Mathematics tasks

We continue to keep all classes covering same concepts within each CfE level to support the teaching and learning if we end up learning from home. All First level P2- 4 pupils are working on Number and Number process with a focus on addition and 2D shapes and 3D objects until October week.

Here is a list of suggested tasks to do at home to complement the learning in class –

- How many different ways can you make 10? E.g.  $1 + 9 = 10$ ? If you want a challenge see how many different ways you can make 20.
- What would you need to add to the following numbers to equal 10? 7, 5, 3, 8.
- Maths Sumdog week competition – 1000 questions to answer starting 25<sup>th</sup> September to 1<sup>st</sup> October
- Maths week is the week beginning 28<sup>th</sup> September. We'd like the children to enter a national competition. *Maths inside* is a photo competition open to everyone living in Scotland. Three themes to choose from **in the home** & **oot an' aboot** and **complete the pattern**

- Practise writing your numbers up to 20, if you want a challenge try to write them to 100! (Make sure your numbers are round the correct way). You can do this with chalk, pencils, pens etc.
- Go on a shape hunt round your house, how many squares, triangles and circles can you spot? Challenge- can you find any pentagons or hexagons?

- Choose a spelling strategy to practise your common words.
- Complete oa, ay and ea worksheet attached.
- Choose 4 words with your phoneme to write on a bit of paper- do this three times. Split the cards with a partner and play a game of snap.
- Attached is a list of all of the Primary 1 common words and initial sounds, practise the sounds in the alphabet and practise reading 10 of the common words each day.
- Write a sentence about something you did at the weekend or some news you would like to share. Remember capital letters, finger spaces and full stops.
